EXCLUDE all State-operated facilities and locally or privately-operated facilities used ONLY to house juveniles for:

· Non-criminal behavior (neglect, abuse, abandonment, or dependency);

OR

Being Persons in Need of Services (PINS) or Children in Need of Services (CHINS) who have assigned beds for reasons other than offenses.

Section II - YOUTH-ON-YOUTH SEXUAL VIOLENCE

DEFINITIONS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE

The definition of "rape" as required under the Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003 will be operationalized by disaggregating sexual assault into two categories of youth-on-youth SEXUAL VIOLENCE. These categories reflect uniform definitions formulated by the National Center for Injury Prevention and Control, in "Sexual Violence Surveillance: Uniform Definitions and Recommended Data Elements," Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The categories of youth-on-youth SEXUAL VIOLENCE are:

NONCONSENSUAL SEXUAL ACTS:

Contact of any person without his or her consent, or of a person who is unable to consent or refuse;

AND

Contact between the penis and the vagina or the penis and the anus including penetration, however slight;

OR

Contact between the mouth and the penis, vagina, or

OR

Penetration of the anal or genital opening of another person by a hand, finger, or other object.

ABUSIVE SEXUAL CONTACTS:

Contact of any person without his or her consent, or of a person who is unable to consent or refuse;

AND

- Intentional touching, either directly or through the clothing, of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or buttocks of any person.
- Exclude incidents in which the intent of the sexual contact is to harm or debilitate rather than sexually exploit.
