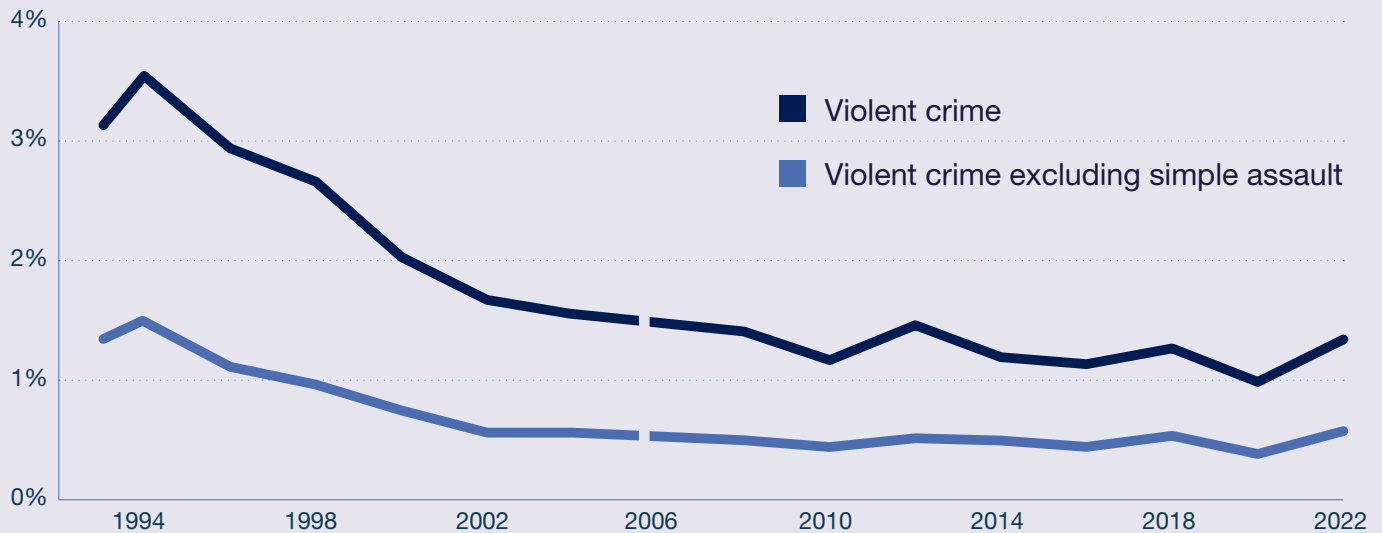


Key Findings from the 2022 NCVS

After reaching a 30-year low during 2020–2021, an estimated **1.24%** of persons age 12 or older in the U.S. experienced at least one violent crime in 2022.



Estimates for 2006 should not be compared to other years.

Violent crime

includes rape or sexual assault, robbery, aggravated assault, and simple assault.

Property crime

includes burglary or trespassing, motor vehicle theft, and other types of household theft.
