Dear Colleague:

I am pleased to provide you with a copy of Wisconsin Crime and Arrests - 1994. This report is based upon monthly crime and arrest reports submitted by 334 law enforcement agencies throughout Wisconsin. We greatly appreciate the continued efforts of personnel from each of these agencies in collecting and reporting important crime and arrest information.

The first half of the report presents statewide information on crime and arrests together with individual sections on each Index crime. The second half of the report contains more detailed crime and arrest information for individual jurisdictions within the State, organized alphabetically by county.

Some of the most important findings are summarized at the beginning of the report (see page 3 - 1994 Crime and Arrest Facts at a Glance). These include a 2.0 percent decline in reported Index crimes, a 1.7 percent increase in total adult arrests, and an 11.4 percent increase in total juvenile arrests. Also, the 26.6 percent clearance rate in 1994 was the highest recorded in the past twenty years.

If you have any suggestions for improving the report in future years, please let me know. Also, if your Department requires additional copies, please contact our office.

I hope this report meets your needs and trust that you will find it useful. Please contact our office if you need other crime-related statistics throughout the year.

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Crime and Arrests in Wisconsin - 1994

Introduction

This report, prepared by the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance, Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), presents data on crime and arrests in Wisconsin during 1994. From 1970 through 1981 the state Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program, operated by the Crime Information Bureau of the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ), collected, compiled, and reported crime and arrest data for Wisconsin. Beginning in 1971, DOJ also provided data to the national UCR system, a program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Effective December 31, 1981, the state program operated by DOJ was discontinued. The 1981 data collected by DOJ were transmitted directly to the FBI, and the 1981 Wisconsin Crime and Arrests report, prepared by SAC, was based for the most part on information provided to SAC by the FBI. In 1982 and again in 1984 Wisconsin law enforcement agencies transmitted their UCR data directly to the FBI, but in addition, provided copies of the principal offense and arrest forms to the Statistical Analysis Center. As of 1984, Wisconsin resumed its status as part of the national UCR system. Since 1984, Wisconsin law enforcement agencies have provided complete UCR data to SAC, which in turn, has transmitted the data to the FBI via computer tape.

The National UCR Program

The national Uniform Crime Reporting Program was initiated in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). After soliciting input from law enforcement agencies throughout the country, an IACP committee developed uniform crime definitions and reporting procedures which could be used by law enforcement agencies in every state. The FBI was designated as the national clearinghouse for UCR data. The Committee on Uniform Crime Records of the IACP continues to serve the national program in an advisory capacity. In 1956, the National Sheriff's Association also established a Committee on Uniform Crime Reports to act as an advisory body to the program. The FBI regularly receives data on reported crime and arrests from law enforcement agencies throughout the country. The data are provided either by individual law enforcement agencies or by state UCR programs which collect and compile data for their states and convey the data to the FBI. From these data the FBI publishes its annual report, Crime in the United States.

The Wisconsin UCR Program

The FBI recognized the Wisconsin Council on Criminal Justice (WCCJ) as the administrator of the Wisconsin State Uniform Crime Reporting Program effective January 1, 1984. It should be noted that the WCCJ was changed to the Office of Justice Assistance as of October 1, 1987. As indicated above, the original Wisconsin UCR program, operated by DOJ, was discontinued in 1981. The program operated by DOJ from 1970 through 1981 required that all law enforcement agencies submit UCR data either directly or through the county sheriff's office. It also required that DOJ submit the prescribed data to the FBI. DOJ expanded the national UCR program's classifications to collect more detailed and appropriate data on Wisconsin crime and arrests. From the statewide UCR data, DOJ published its annual report Wisconsin Crime and Arrests, as well as quarterly, semi-annual, and other summary reports.

In November 1981, the WCCJ received a grant from the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics, to develop Wisconsin's Statistical Analysis Center. The SAC was mandated by executive order to collect and analyze criminal justice data, produce statistical reports on crime and the justice system, and promote development of criminal justice information systems. From 1981 through 1984, SAC assumed a substantial number of the functions of the state UCR program to meet the information needs of state and local criminal justice decision-makers, elected officials and interested citizens. Since January 1984, Wisconsin has been recognized officially by the FBI as having a State UCR Program and is again part of the national system of state UCR programs.

Incident - Based Reporting (IBR)

For nearly sixty years the UCR Program remained virtually unchanged in terms of the amount and type of data collected and disseminated. By the 1980s it had become obvious that the nature of modern law enforcement record keeping had diminished the utility of the existing UCR system. As a result, the FBI initiated a thorough evaluation of the existing UCR system with the purpose of formulating a phased-in redesign effort to enable the UCR Program to meet the needs of law enforcement into the 21st century.

Based upon the recommendations of the redesign study, the FBI proceeded to develop a significantly revamped UCR system which includes the following elements:

- the addition of significant new offenses
- increased information on victims, offenders, arrestees, and characteristics of the offense
- improved quality control
- expanded user services

The major point of the revision is a change from a summary-based reporting program to an incident-based system in which information about each offense, offender, victim, and arrestee is linked by a common incident number.

Based upon the success of a pilot project in South Carolina, the FBI released the final data elements and offense specifications in July, 1988. At that time Wisconsin and other state programs began a careful implementation of the enhanced program. Several Wisconsin agencies have begun data submissions under the incident-based reporting format since 1991. The following Wisconsin agencies have been certified for IBR submission: Wauwatosa PD, Chetek PD, West Bend PD, and the Calumet County Sheriff. Sample IBR data are presented in Appendix IV of this report.

Due to the increased reporting requirements of the new program, both the FBI and the Wisconsin UCR Program are encouraging a phased-in transition where law enforcement agencies will be able to adopt the new program as they acquire the necessary data processing capabilities. It is anticipated that Wisconsin will be operating a dual collection program for the next decade, with some departments reporting under summary-based guidelines, while others with automated records systems will make the transition to an IBR system.

Issues in Comparison of this Report with Earlier Reports

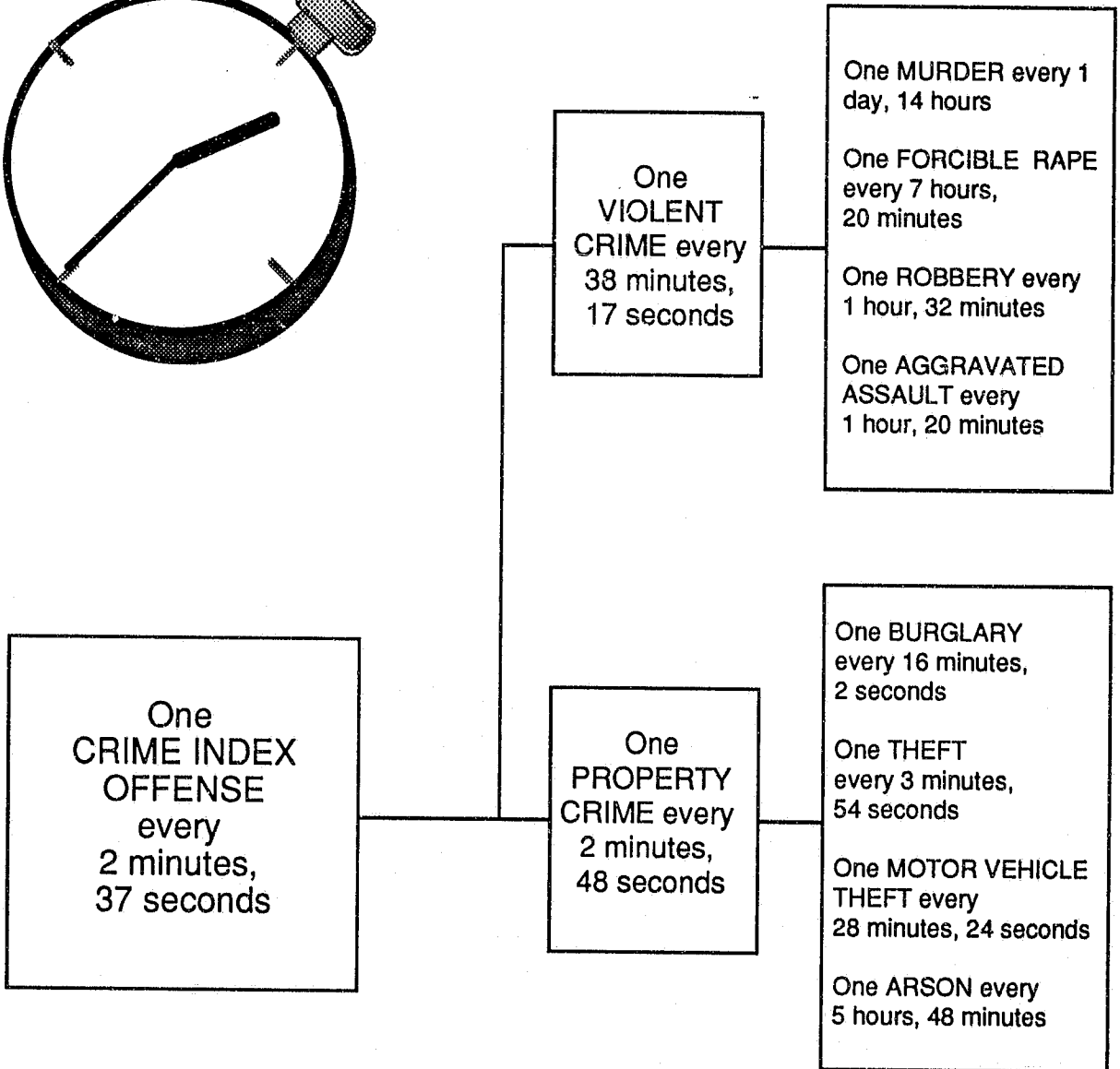
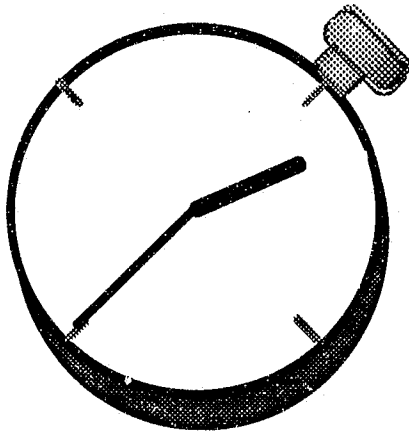
Care should be exercised in making comparisons of the data in this report with the data contained in previous annual reports. Adjustments may be required for the following reasons:

- Shifting of a law enforcement agency from one population category to another based on annual re-estimation of the jurisdiction's population.
- On occasion, the Federal Government designates an additional Wisconsin county as being included in a Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA). This would shift a Sheriff's Office from the Rural Areas category to the Suburban Sheriffs' group. As an example, Pierce County was designated as being in an SMSA in 1992. Hence, the Pierce County Sheriff's Office moved from the Rural Areas category to the Suburban Sheriff's group. (See footnote 5 on page 15 for a listing of the twenty Suburban Sheriffs' Offices.)
- Populations are estimated for non-census years. Rates for 1994 are calculated using 1990 census data, updated with 1994 estimates published by the Demographic Services Center, Wisconsin Department of Administration.
- County totals shown in Tables 1-9 of this report are estimates which compensate for instances of missing data when appropriate.

1994 Crime and Arrest Facts at a Glance

- On the average, one **Index Crime** was reported every 2 minutes, 37 seconds in Wisconsin during 1994. (page 4)
- There were 201,337 serious crimes (**Index Offenses**) reported in 1994, a decrease of 2.0 percent from the 1993 total. (page 6)
- A total of 423,574 **arrests** were made in 1994. (page 9) While total **adult arrests** increased by 1.7 percent, **juvenile arrests** increased by 11.4 percent. (pages 7 & 8)
- The 1994 **crime rate** for Wisconsin was 3,977.9 serious crimes for each 100,000 residents. This figure is 28 percent lower than the 1993 national crime rate of 5,529 per 100,000. (page 13)
- Overall, 26.6 percent of the Index crimes were cleared, the highest **clearance rate** in the past twenty years. (page 13)
- **Violent Index Crime** increased by 3.2 percent in 1994 and has increased by 46.8 percent from 1984 to 1994. (pages 19 and 92)
- The 39.4 percent **property recovery rate** in 1994 was much higher than the 32 percent recovery rate in 1993. (page 25)
- Nearly 62 percent of all **murder** offenders were between 15 and 24 years of age. (page 33)
- The number of **sexual assaults** decreased by 12.6 percent, from 7,487 in 1993 to 6,546 during 1994. (page 40)
- The proportion of **robberies** involving a firearm was 54.5 percent in 1994. (page 50)
- **Aggravated assault** increased by 7.6 percent in 1994.
- The number of reported **burglaries** has decreased by 17.6 percent from 1984 to 1994. (pages 59 & 92)
- **Theft** accounted for 67.1 percent of the total Crime Index.
- Over 63 percent of those arrested for **motor vehicle theft** in 1994 were juveniles.
- **Arson** increased by 9.6 percent, from 1,378 in 1993 to 1,511 during 1994.
- There were major increases in certain Part II **arrests** including drug law violations (32.3 percent) and curfew law violations (42.7 percent). (pages 83 and 85)
- Persons between 18 and 20 years of age accounted for nearly 53 percent of the 35,344 arrests for **liquor law violations**. (page 85)
- Six Wisconsin **law enforcement officers** were **killed** while in the performance of their duty; four of these were killed feloniously (page 96)
- There were 769 reported **assaults on law enforcement officers**; a 0.9 percent increase from the 762 in 1993. (page 96)
- There were 39 "**Hate Crimes**" reported in 1994. (page 212)

¹ The crime clock should be viewed with care. Being the most aggregate representation of UCR data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of the Index Offenses. This method of display does not imply a regularity in the commission of Index Offenses; rather it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed time intervals.

An Overview of 1993 and 1994 Crime and Arrests in Wisconsin

The following tables and maps present an overview of 1993 and 1994 crime and arrests in Wisconsin. Table 1 shows that reported Index Offenses have decreased by 2.0 percent from 1993. While reported violent offenses have increased by 3.2 percent from 1993, property offenses have decreased by 2.3 percent. The overall increase in violent offenses is due to increases in each of the four violent offenses except forcible rape. The largest increase involved aggravated assault which increased by 7.6 percent, from 6,110 to 6,572. Murder increased by 2.3 percent, from 222 to 227 and robbery increased by 0.4 percent, from 5,712 to 5,732. However, forcible rape decreased by 5.4 percent, from 1,259 to 1,194. Also, violent offenses constituted only 6.8 percent of Index Offenses for Wisconsin during 1994.

Property crimes comprise the balance of the Crime Index. The overall decrease in reported property crimes from 1993 to 1994 was due to decreases in each of the four property crimes except arson. Burglary decreased by 1.9 percent, from 33,393 to 32,764. Theft decreased by 2.8 percent, from 139,000 to 135,045. Motor vehicle theft decreased by 0.3 percent, from 18,354 to 18,292. However, arson increased by 9.6 percent, from 1,378 to 1,511.

The next three tables present a comparison of statewide arrests in 1993 and 1994. Adult arrests for total Index Offenses decreased by 1.4 percent, while juvenile arrests for total Index Offenses increased by 3.2 percent. Total arrests for Index Offenses, combining both adults and juveniles, increased by 0.8 percent. Juvenile arrests constituted 47.5 percent of all arrests for Index Offenses in 1994, compared to 46.3 percent in 1993. Total adult arrests increased by 1.7 percent, from 283,063 to 287,807, while total juvenile arrests increased by 11.4 percent, from 121,857 to 135,767. Total arrests for adults and juveniles combined increased by 4.6 percent from 404,920 in 1993 to 423,574 in 1994.

While juvenile arrests comprised 32 percent of all arrests for 1994, they comprised 47.5 percent of arrests for Index Offenses. Among the Index Offenses, juvenile arrests comprised 29.8 percent of all arrests for violent offenses and 50.1 percent of all arrests for property offenses.

Following the set of four tables are two maps showing rates of violent and property crime in each Wisconsin county for 1994. On each map, counties are ranked in four groups according to number of offenses per 100,000 population. The statewide rate, shown on each map, is based on the statewide number of offenses and population. This rate is within the fourth quartile for both maps because most of the highest crime rates are in those counties with largest populations.

An analysis of total Index Offenses, violent offenses, property offenses, and each separate Index Offense appears in the next major section of this report. The following section contains more detailed information on arrests for all UCR crime categories. Ten-year trends in offenses, offense rates, clearances, and arrest ratios are then presented, followed by data on law enforcement officers killed and assaulted. The final half of the book consists of a series of tables with individual agency data presented alphabetically by county. Tables include Index Offenses, offense rates, clearance rates, property loss, arrests (both adult and juvenile), and law enforcement employees.

In addition, several appendices are included:

- II: Examples of use of UCR statistics by local agencies
- III: Hate Crime
- IV: Incident-Based Data Examples
- V: Arrests

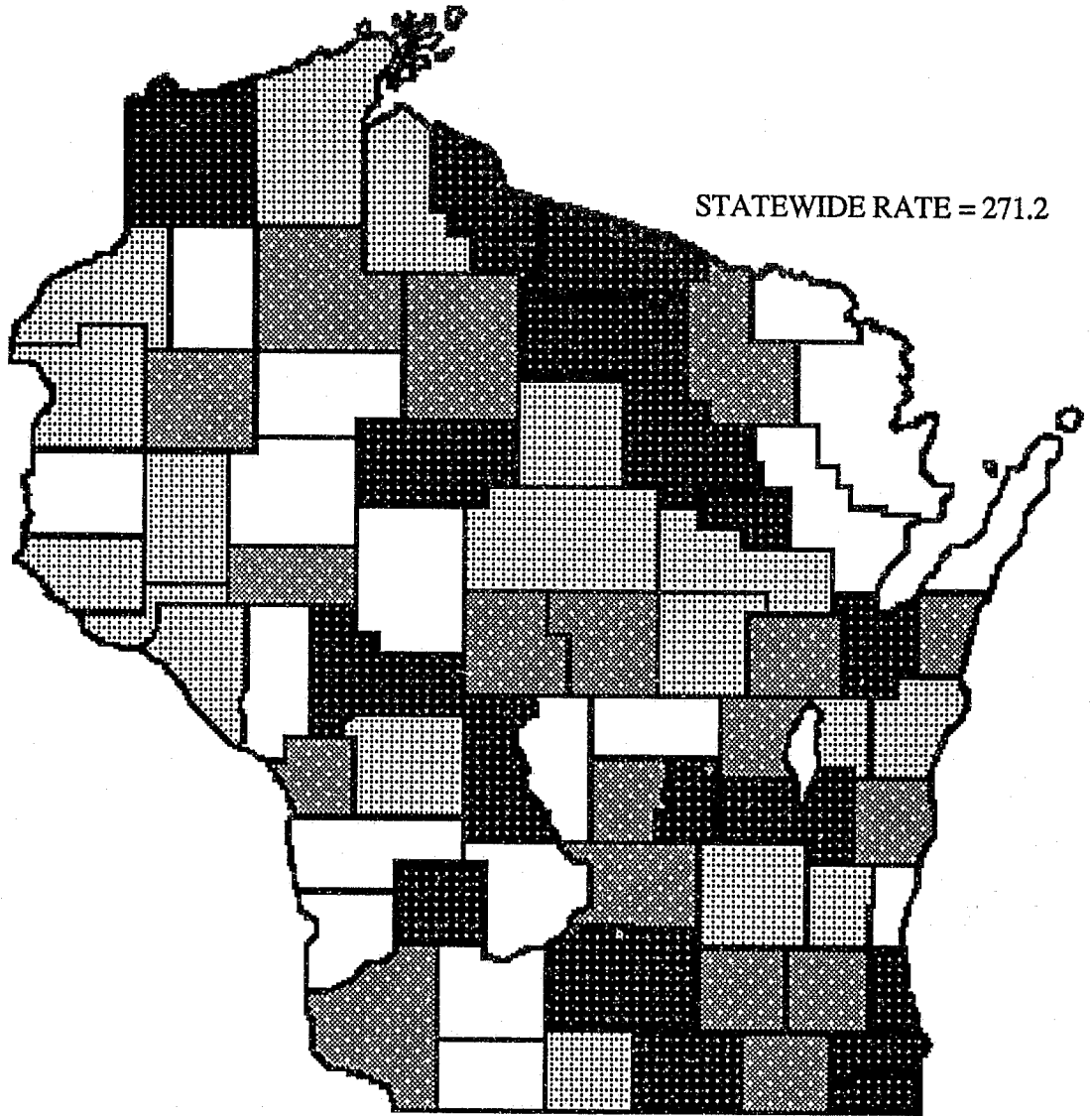

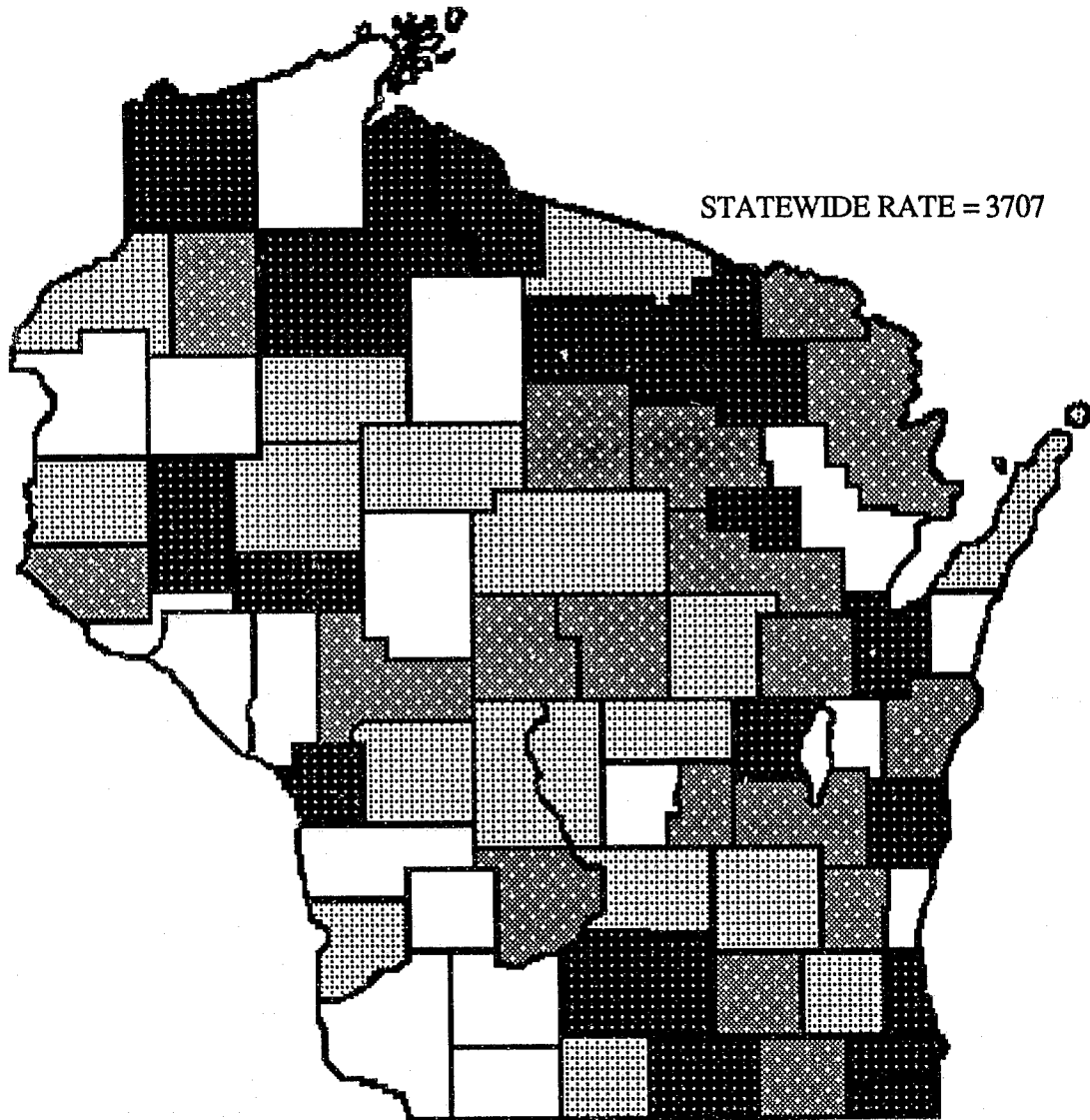

CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

Definition:¹ Crime Index Offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Attempts are included (an attempted murder is classified as an aggravated assault).

1994 Summary Analysis

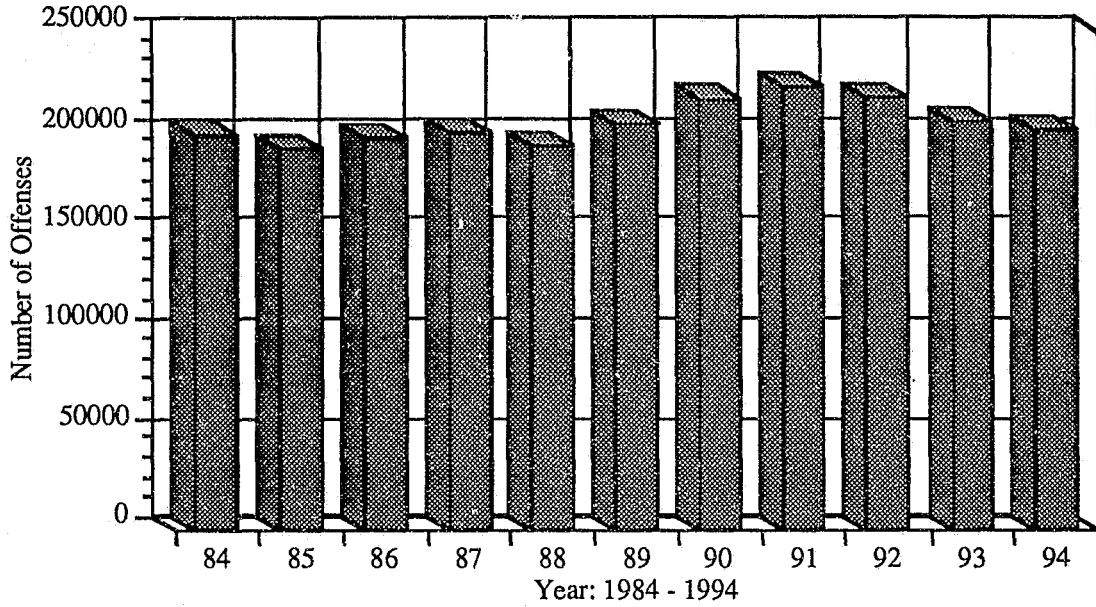
- There were an estimated 201,337 Crime Index Offenses reported during 1994, a 2.0 percent decrease from 1993.
- One Index Offense was reported approximately every two minutes, 37 seconds during 1994.
- The most frequent month for Crime Index Offenses was August (20,349) while the least frequent was February (11,708). These high and low months were the same as in 1993.
- The Crime Index Offense rate per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 3,977.9 in 1994, a decrease of 2.8 percent from the 1993 rate of 4,091.4 per 100,000.
- The 1994 Crime Index Offense rate of 3,977.9 per 100,000 was approximately 28 percent less than the 1993 rate of 5,529 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- In terms of the population groupings of Wisconsin jurisdictions, the larger the population category, generally the higher the rate of Index Offenses.
- During 1994 total offense rates decreased for each population grouping of Wisconsin jurisdictions except police agencies serving more than 250,000 residents and rural Sheriff Offices.
- Total Index Offenses have increased by 0.7 percent between 1984 and 1994. However, after peaking in 1991, they have declined by 9.7 percent.
- An estimated total of 68,753 persons were arrested for Index Offenses in 1994, an increase of 0.8 percent. Of these, 52.5 percent were adults.
- Overall, 26.6 percent of Index Offenses were cleared in 1994. Clearance rates varied widely, however, from 85 percent for murder to 17.3 percent for burglary.
- The overall 1994 clearance rate of 26.6 percent was more than the 1993 rate of 26.3 percent and was the highest clearance rate during the past twenty years.

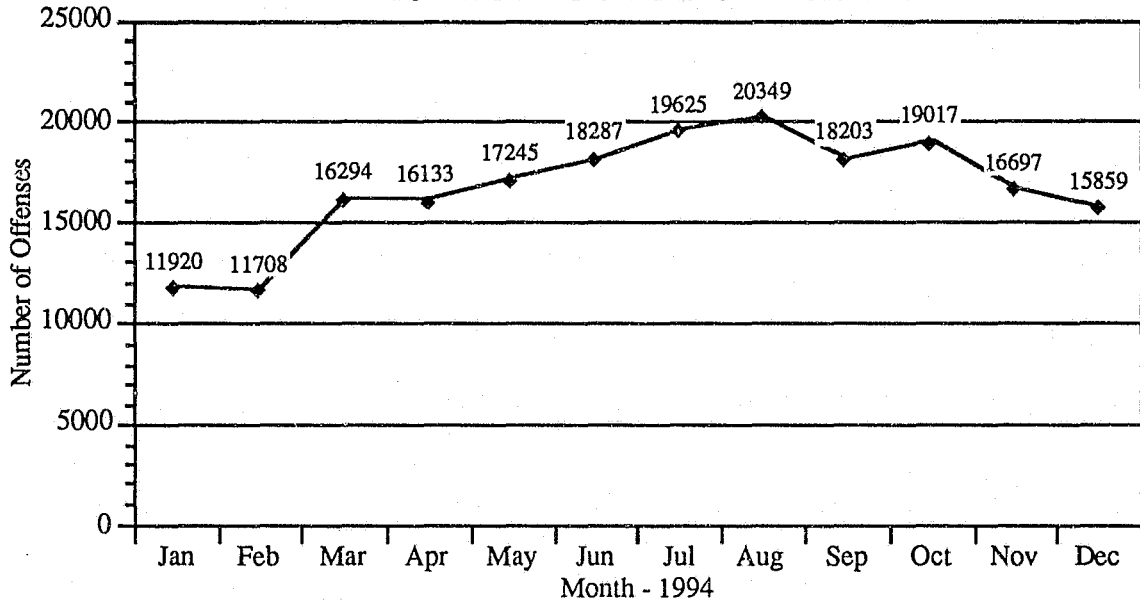

TOTAL INDEX OFFENSES BY YEAR



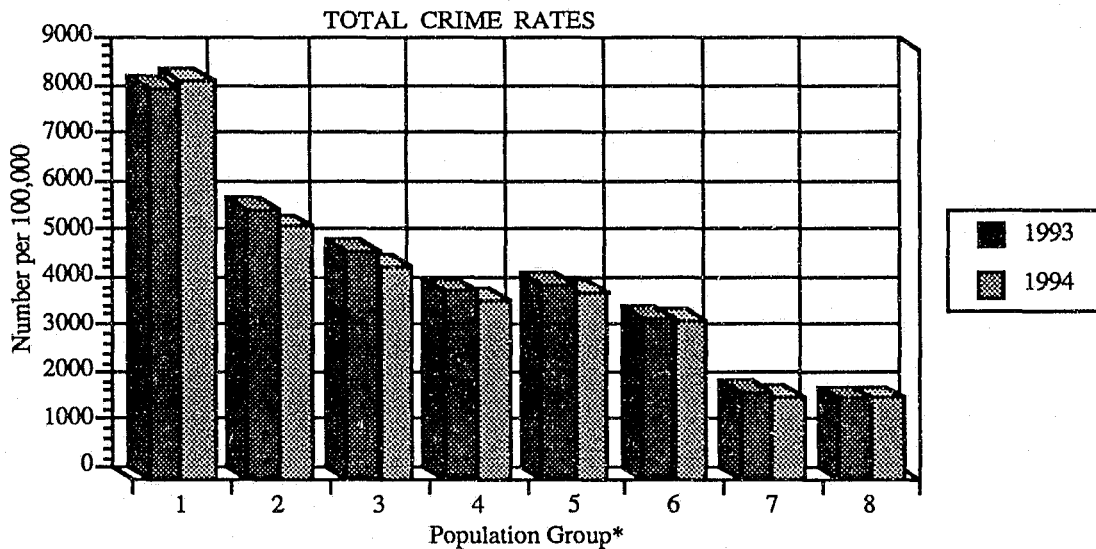
TOTAL INDEX OFFENSES - BY MONTH

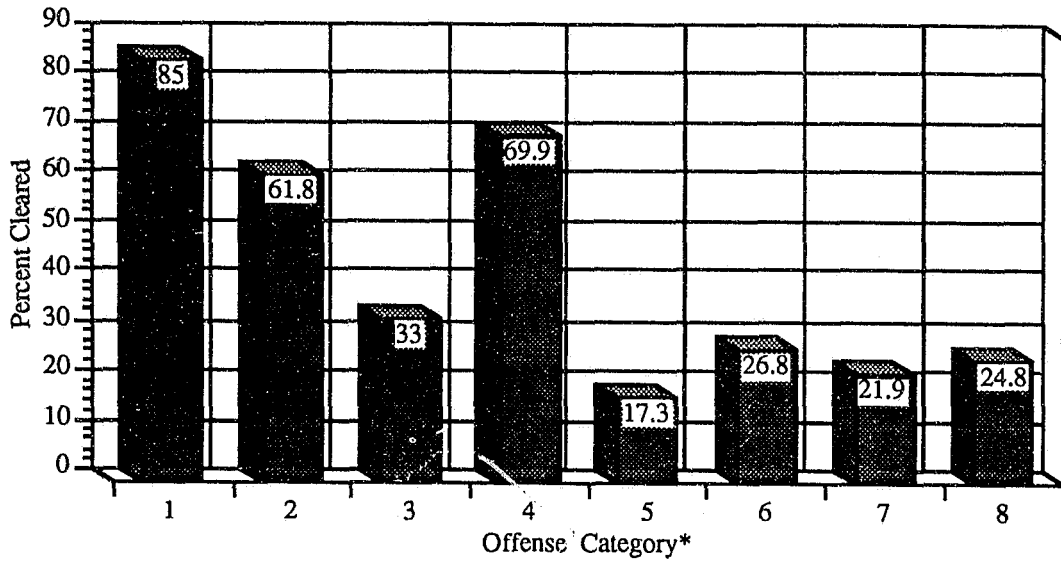

Definition: Four Crime Index Offenses involve face-to-face confrontation between victim and perpetrator, and are referred to as violent offenses. These are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault.

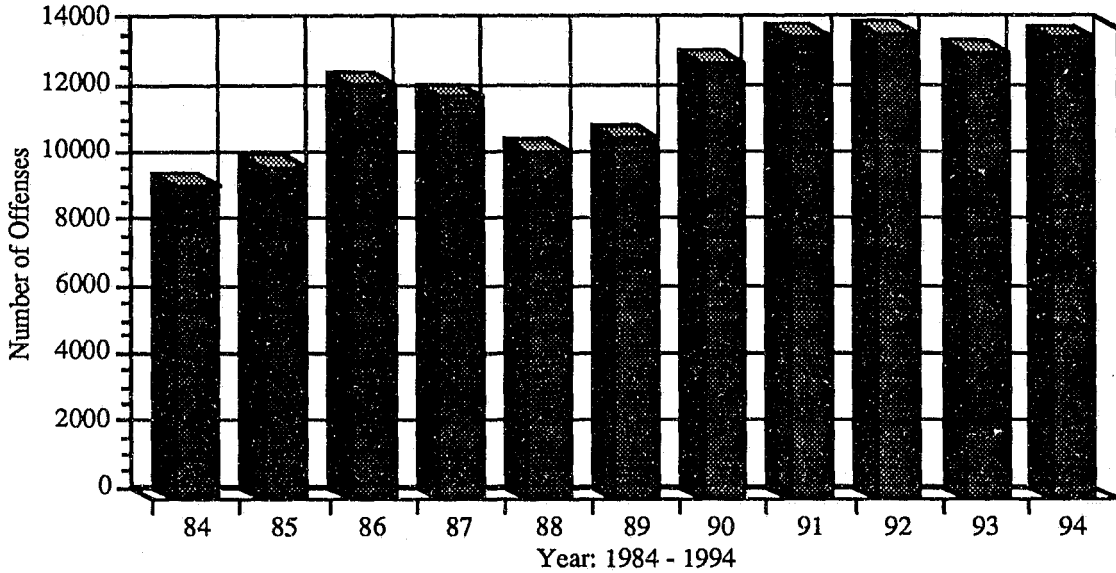
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 13,725 violent offenses reported during 1994, a 3.2 percent increase from 1993.
- Violent Index Offenses accounted for 6.8 percent of the total Crime Index in 1994.
- Approximately one violent offense was reported every 38 minutes, 17 seconds during 1994.
- The most frequent month for violent crimes was December (1,310), the least frequent month was February (895).
- The Violent Offense rate per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 271.2 in 1994, an increase of 2.4 percent from the 1993 rate of 264.9 per 100,000.
- The 1994 Violent Offense rate of 271.2 per 100,000 is approximately 64 percent less than the 1993 rate of 746 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- During 1994 total violent offense rates decreased for each population grouping of Wisconsin jurisdictions except for cities with over 50,000 residents.
- Violent Index Offenses have increased 46.8 percent between 1984 and 1994.
- An estimated total of 8,979 persons were arrested for violent offenses in 1994, an increase of 12.6 percent from 1993.
- Adults made up 70.2 percent of all those arrested for violent offenses.
- Overall, 54 percent of violent offenses were cleared in 1994, slightly more than the 53.4 percent clearance rate in 1993.

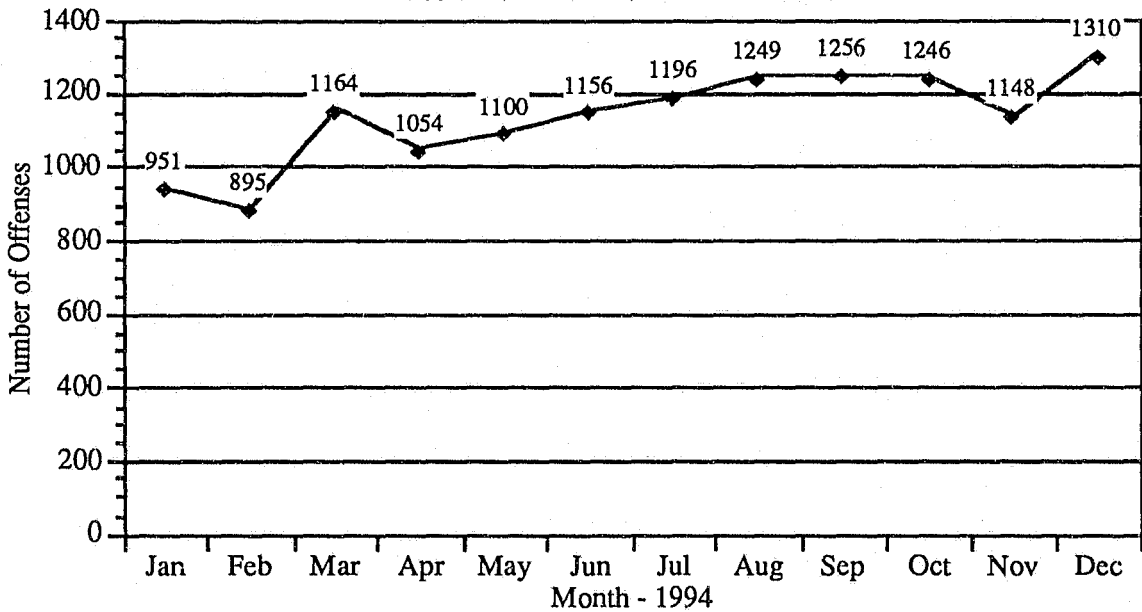

VIOLENT OFFENSES - BY YEAR

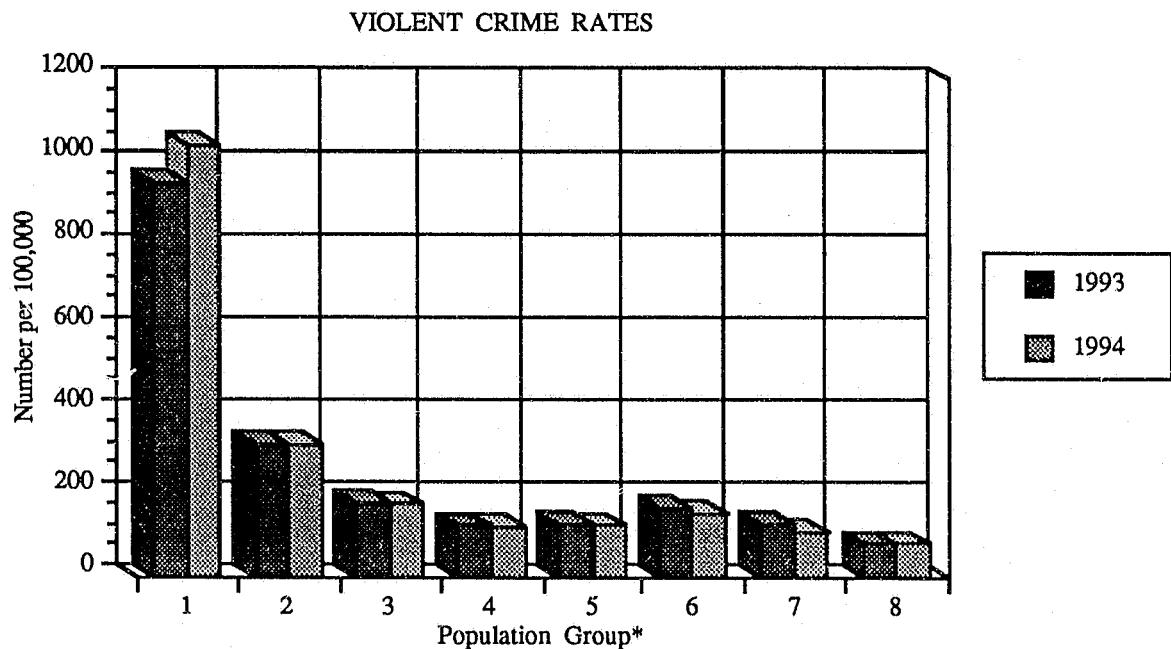


VIOLENT OFFENSES - BY MONTH

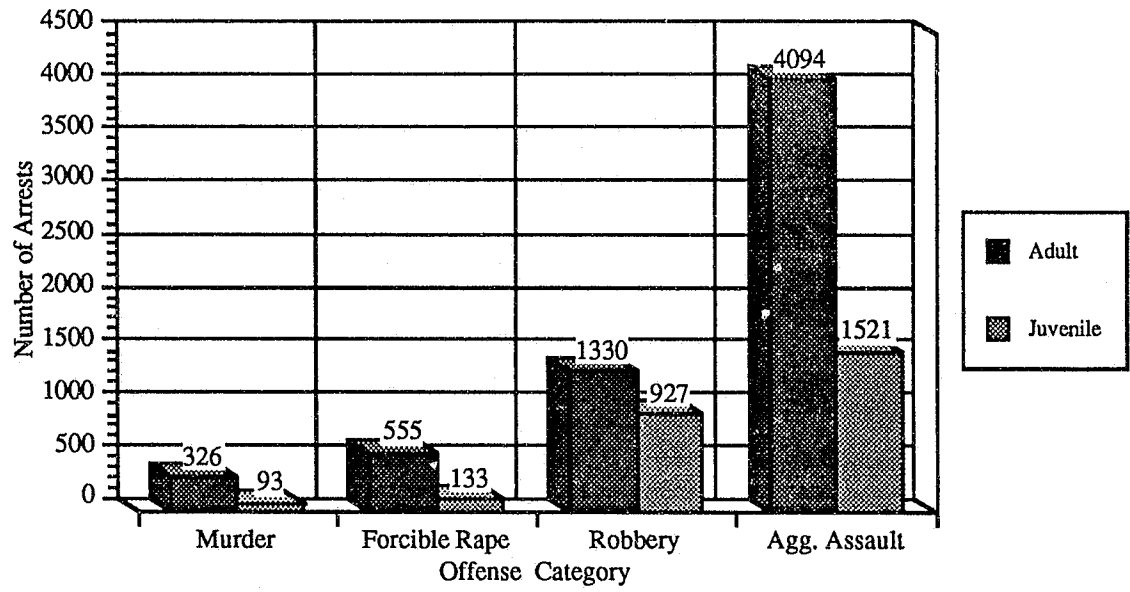

PROPERTY OFFENSES

Definition: Four Crime Index Offenses do not involve face-to-face confrontation between victim and perpetrator, and are referred to as property offenses. These offenses are burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

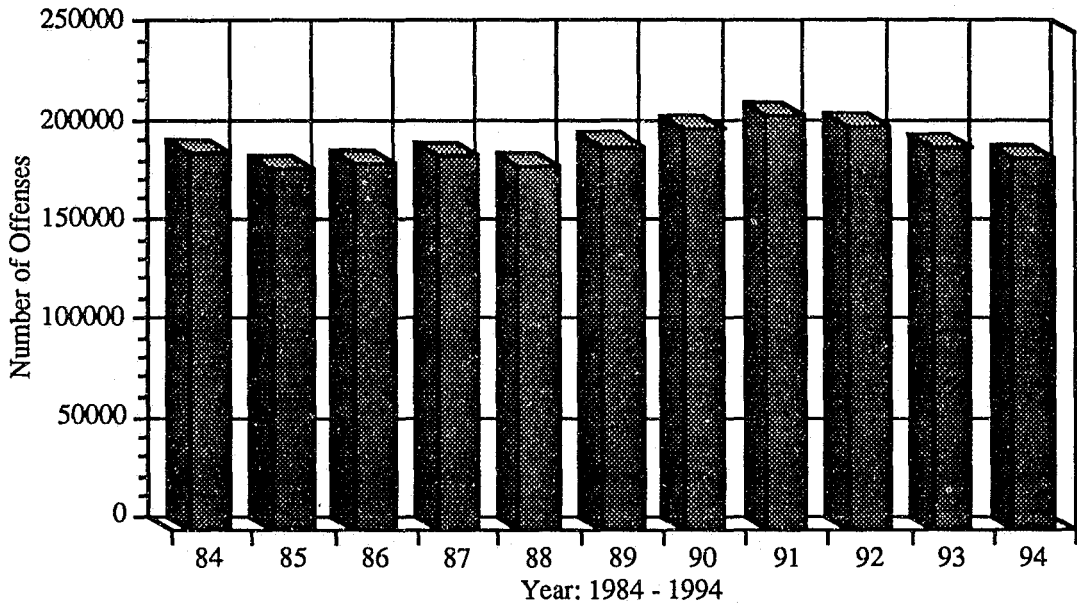
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 187,612 property offenses reported in 1994, a 2.3 percent decrease from 1993.
- Property Index Offenses accounted for 93.2 percent of the total Crime Index in 1994.
- Approximately one property offense was reported every two minutes, 48 seconds in Wisconsin during 1994.
- The most frequent months for property offenses were August (19,100) while the least frequent month was February (10,813).
- The Property Offense rate per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 3,706.7 in 1994, a decrease of 3.1 percent from the 1993 rate of 3,826.4 per 100,000.
- The 1994 Property Offense rate of 3,706.7 per 100,000 was approximately 22 percent less than the 1993 rate of 4,783 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Property offense rates decreased in all jurisdiction categories except police agencies serving more than 250,000 residents during 1994.
- Property Index Offenses have decreased 1.5 percent between 1984 and 1994.
- An estimated total of 59,774 arrests were made for property offenses in 1994, a decrease of 0.8 percent compared to 1993 arrests. Just over 50 percent of those arrested were juveniles and nearly 69 percent of those arrested were white.
- Overall, 24.6 percent of property offenses were cleared in 1994, a figure slightly more than the 24.4 percent clearance rate in 1993.
- During 1994, 39.4 percent of property stolen was recovered. This figure was much greater than the 32 percent recovery rate in 1993.
- A total of \$144,392,697 in property was stolen in 1994. This figure was 5.9 percent less than the 1993 total of \$153,485,916.

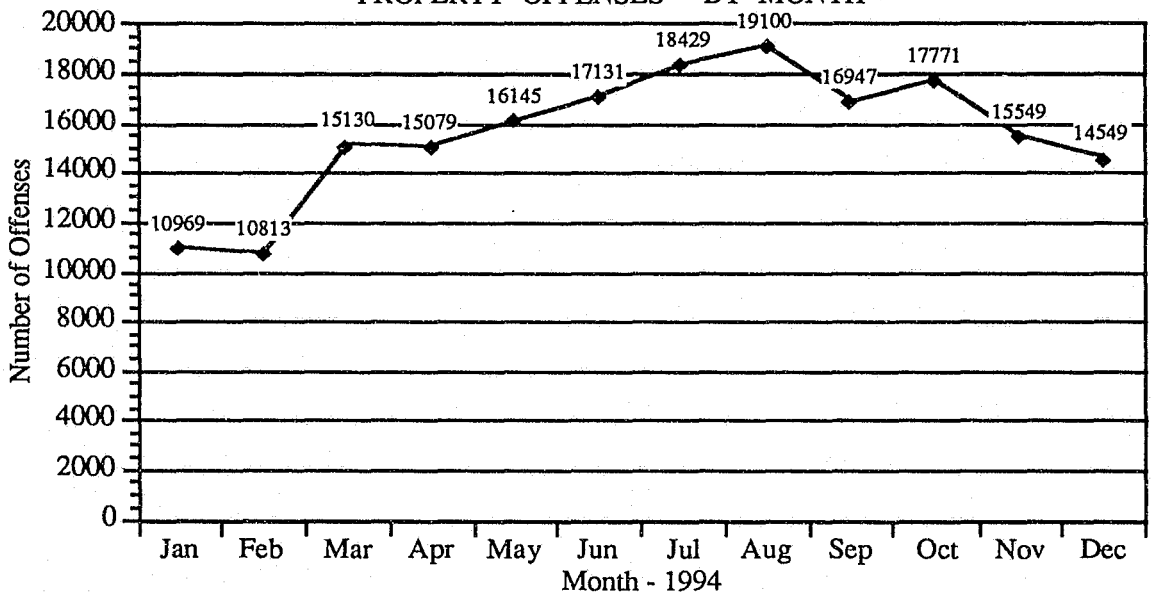

PROPERTY OFFENSES - BY YEAR

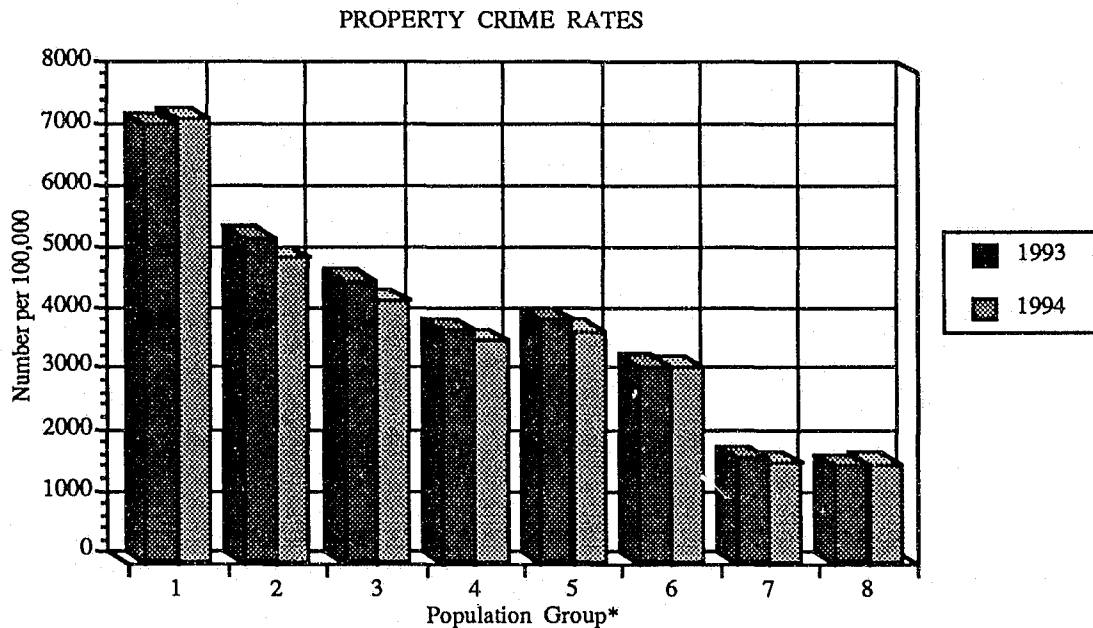


PROPERTY OFFENSES - BY MONTH

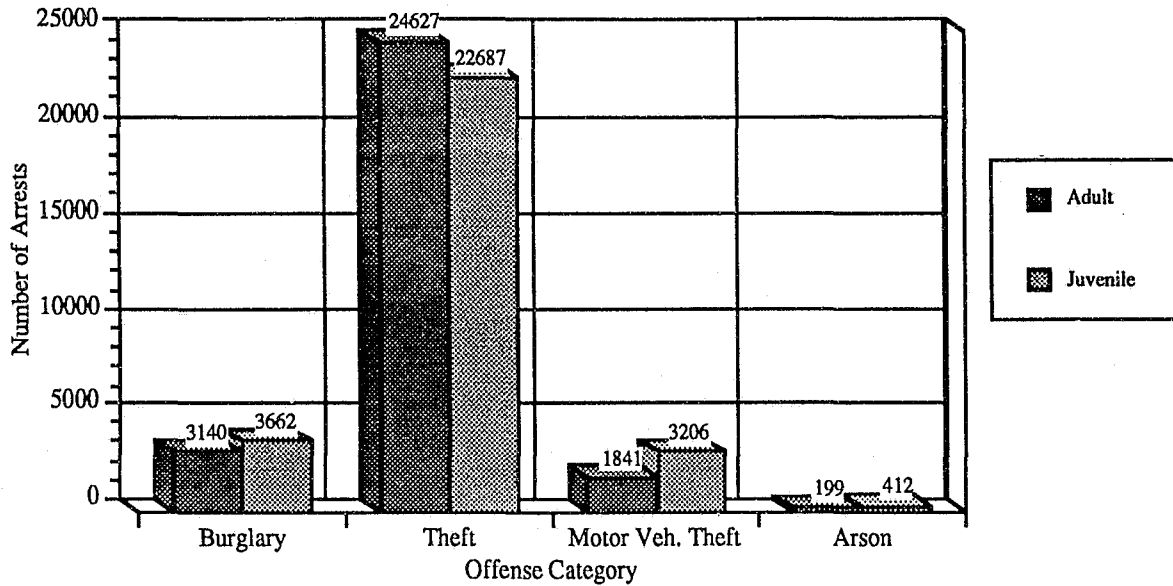

MURDER

Definition: Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter are the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. The classification of this offense, as for all other Crime Index Offenses, is based on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, or accident; justifiable homicides, which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens during commission of the felony; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are classified as aggravated assaults.

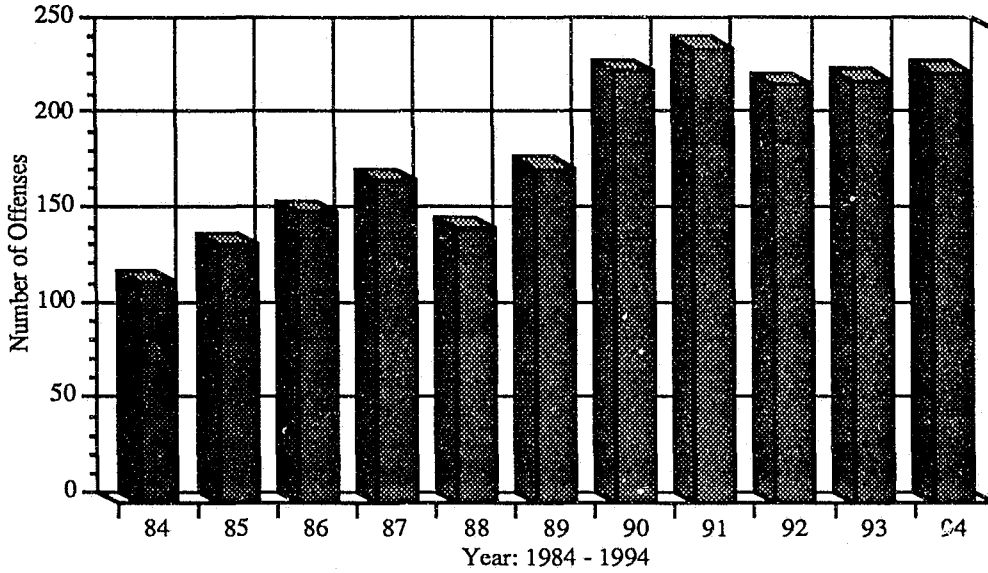
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were 227 murders reported in 1994, a 2.3 percent increase from 1993.
- Murder made up 0.1 percent of the Crime Index and 1.6 percent of all violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one murder was reported every 1 day and 14 hours during 1994.
- The most frequent months for murder were March and December (25 each), the least frequent was February (10).
- The 1994 murder rate was 4.5 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, slightly more than the 4.4 per 100,000 in 1993.
- The 1994 murder rate of 4.5 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was 53 percent less than the 1993 rate of 9.5 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Murder rates increased in all Wisconsin categories of law enforcement agencies except those police departments serving more than 250,000 or fewer than 5,000 residents.
- The volume of Wisconsin murders has increased by 94 percent from 1984 to 1994.
- The average (mean) age of murder victims was 28.4 years, while the mean age of known offenders was 25.6 years.
- Nearly 62 percent of all offenders were between the ages of 15 and 24.
- Firearms were involved in 63.9 percent of 1994 murders, more than the firearms percentage of 60.8 in 1993.
- In those cases where the relationship of victim and offender was determined, the parties were known to each other in about 82 percent of 1994 murders.
- An estimated 419 persons were arrested for murder in 1994 compared to 521 persons in 1993, a decrease of 19.6 percent. Nearly 78 percent of those arrested in 1994 were adults and over 72 percent were black.
- When circumstances of the murder were known, 59.5 percent involved an argument. There was a minimum of sixteen murders related to gang activity.
- A minimum of 31 percent of 1994 murders directly involved drugs or alcohol.
- The murder clearance rate was 85 percent in 1994. This figure was slightly less than the 86.5 percent clearance rate in 1993.
- Over 60 percent of murders occurred between the hours of 6 p.m. and 3 a.m.

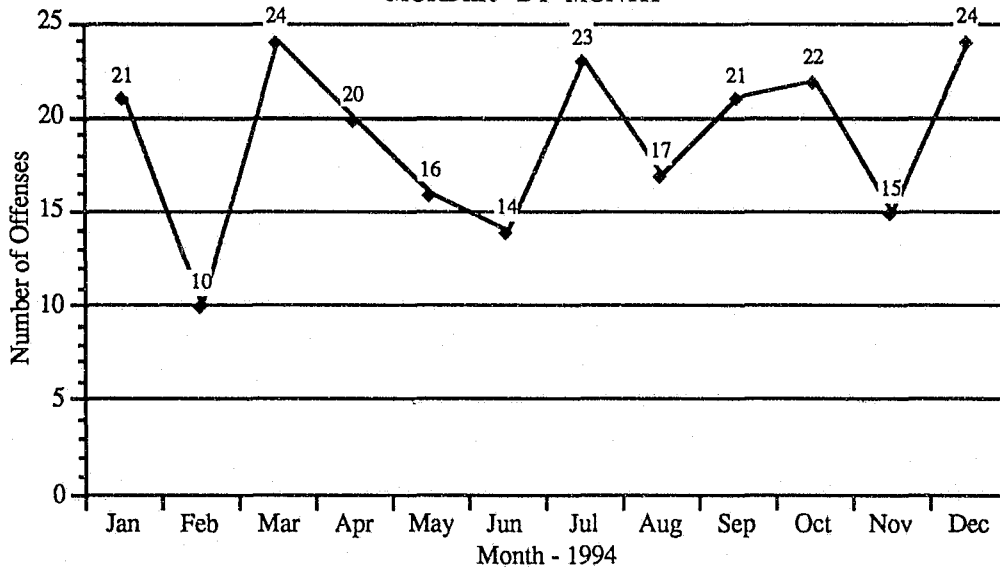

MURDER - BY YEAR



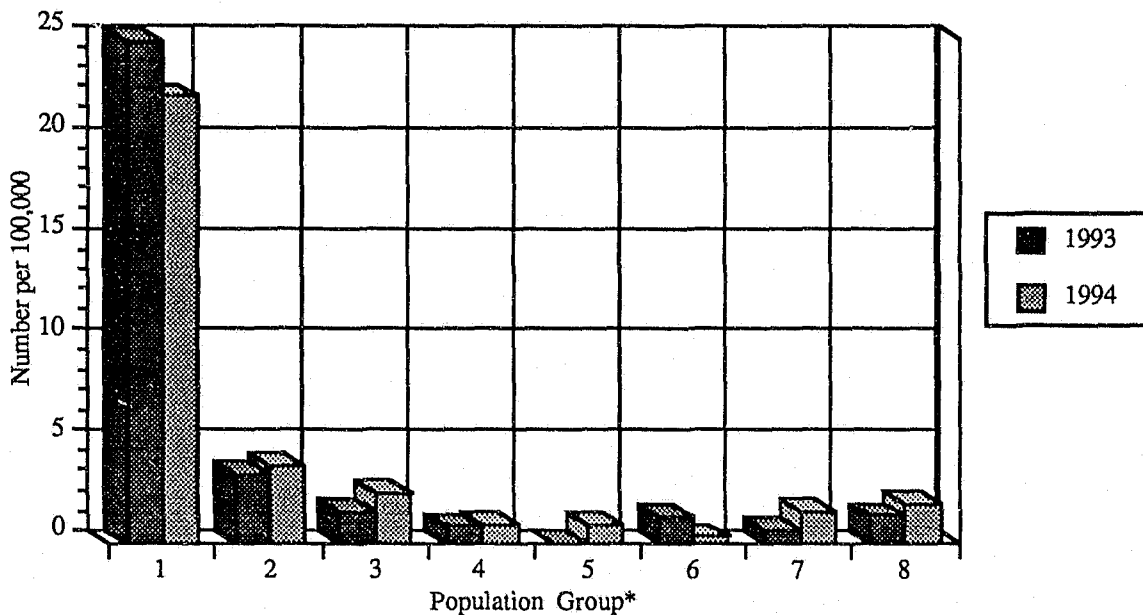
MURDER - BY MONTH

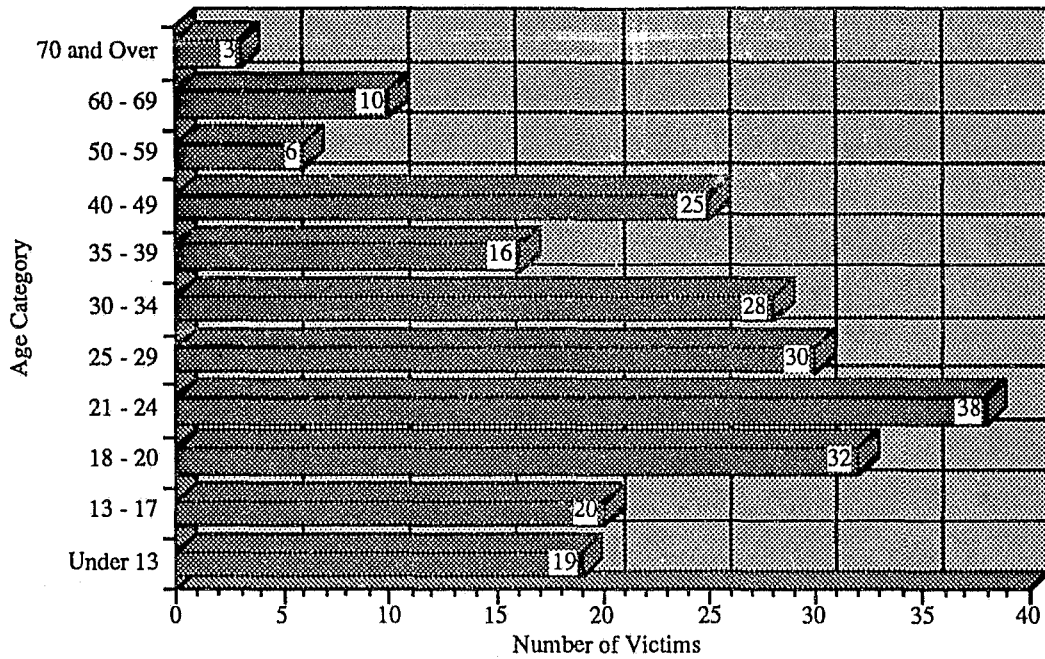

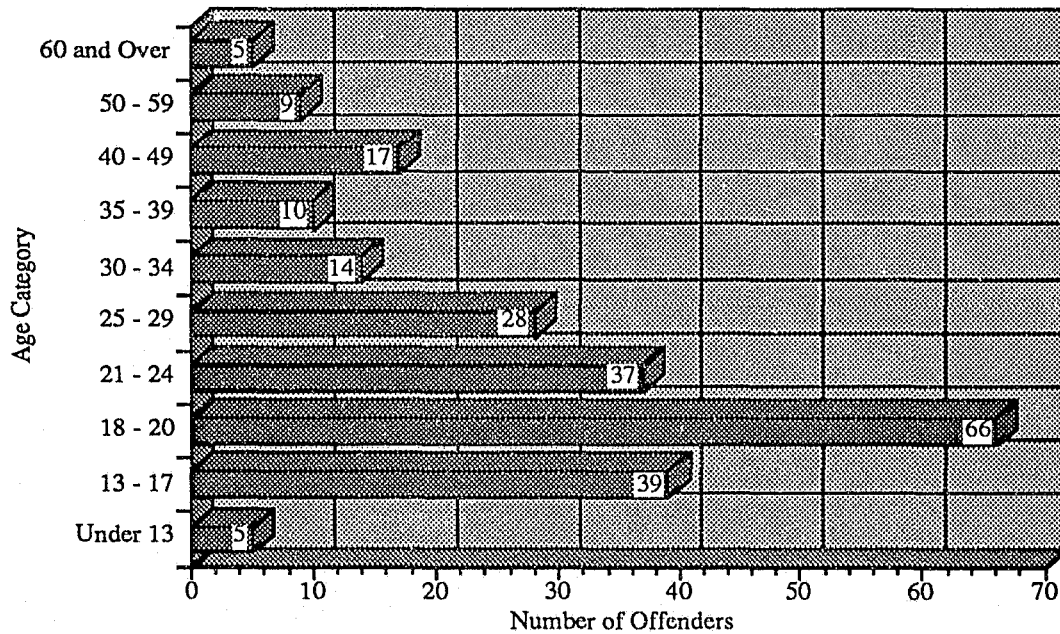

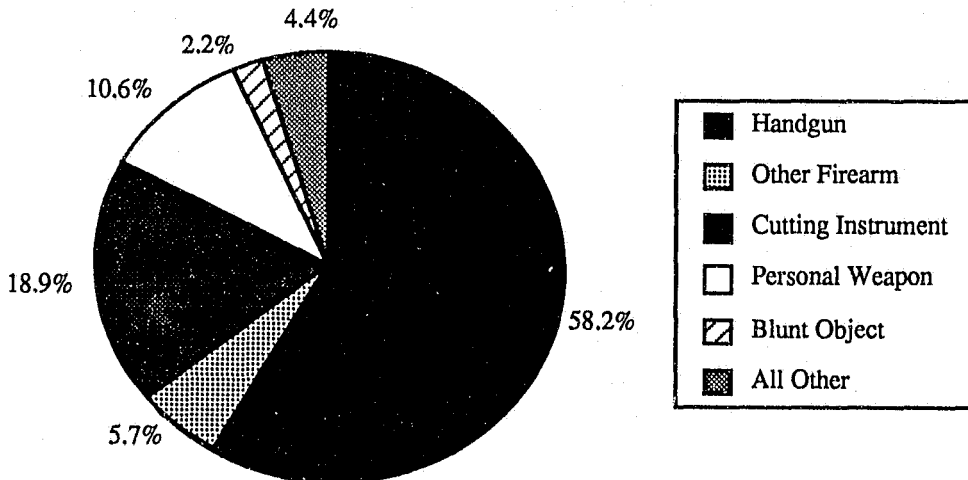

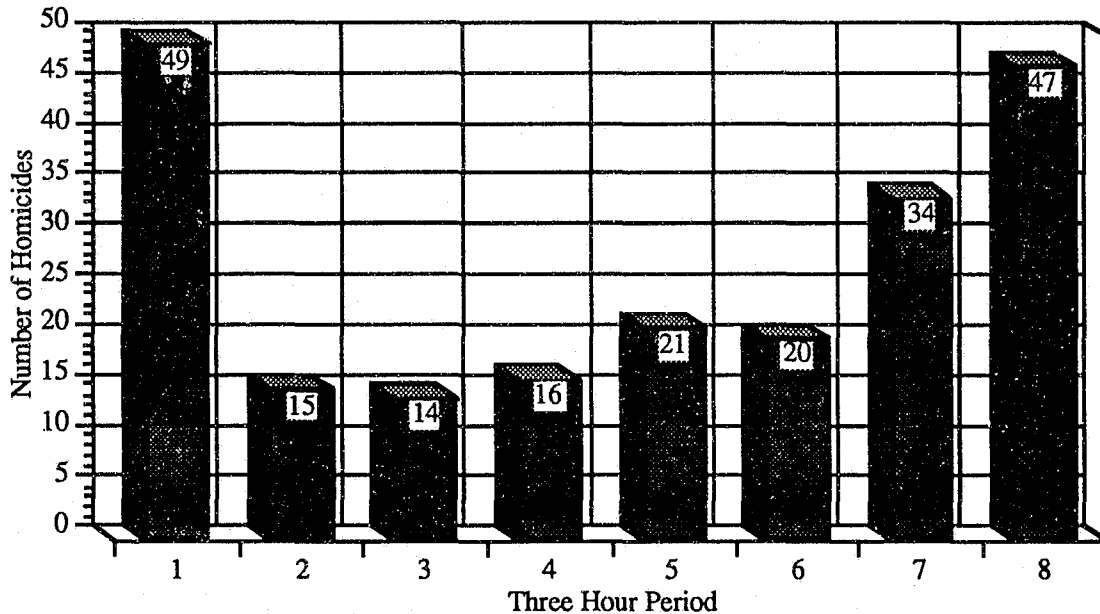

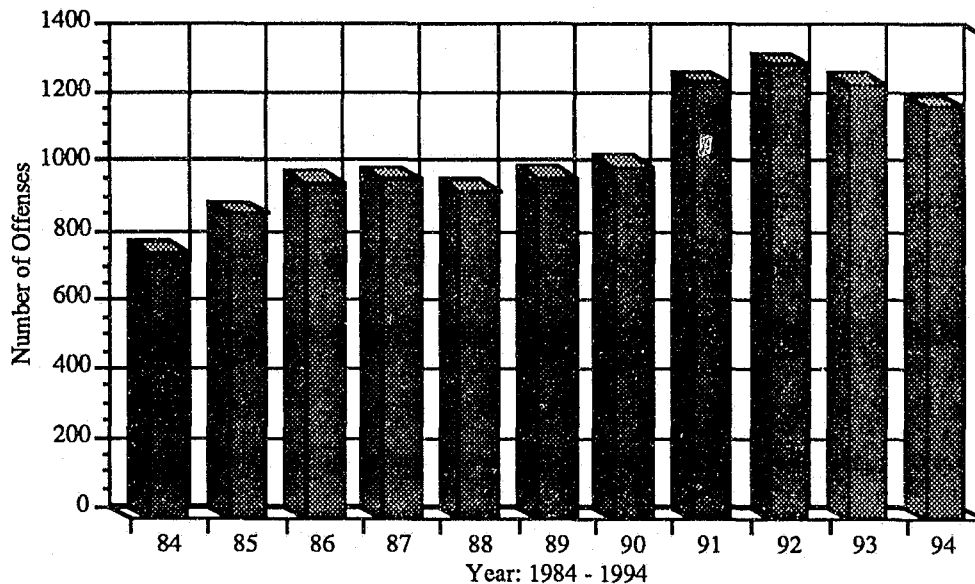
SEXUAL ASSAULT AND FORCIBLE RAPE

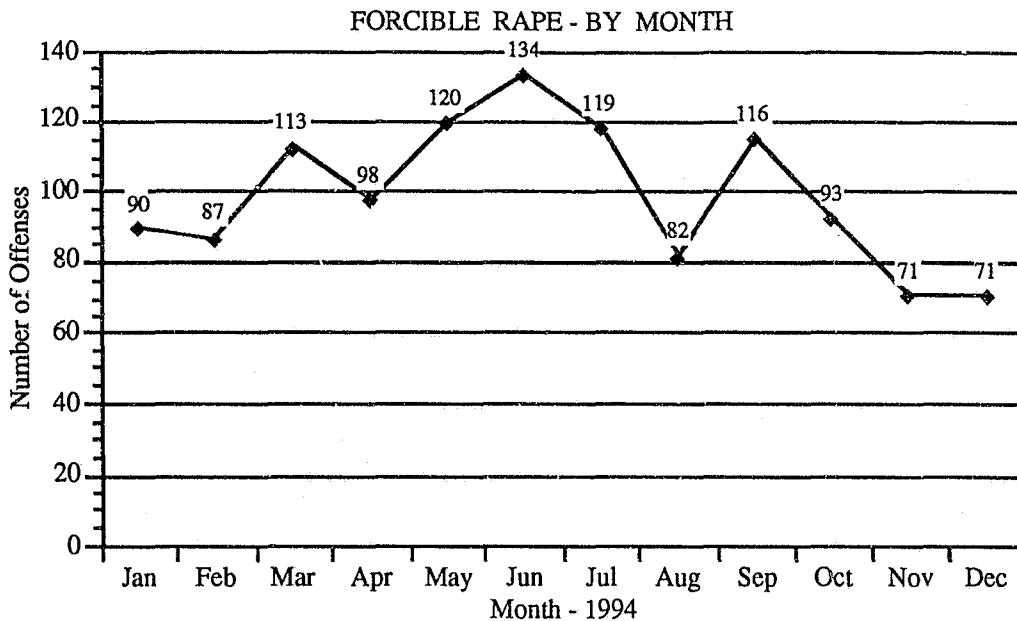
Definition: Sexual assault is sexual contact or sexual intercourse with another person without consent of that person. Sexual assault is proscribed under Wisconsin statutes, but is not part of the Federal Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program. Forcible rape is part of the Crime Index and as such is reported as part of the Federal UCR Program. It is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded.

Sexual Assault - 1994 Summary Analysis

Information on sexual assault is vital to an understanding of crime trends in Wisconsin. Rape is not a legally meaningful category in this state. However, rape is part of the Crime Index and information on rape is vital to the national UCR program. Furthermore, many years of information on rape are available for Wisconsin, and current information on rape is valuable for purposes of comparison. Jurisdiction-by-jurisdiction listings for rape appear in many of the tables in this publication. This listing of rapes will continue in future years as long as rape continues to be part of the Crime Index.

Some major findings from the 1994 sexual assault data are as follows.

- There were 6,546 sexual assaults reported during 1994, a 12.6 percent decrease from the estimated 1993 total of 7,487.
- Approximately 18 percent of all sexual assaults were rapes. For victims 16 and over, the proportion of rapes was much higher, 39 percent.
- Nearly 74 percent of all sexual assault victims were juveniles. Two-thirds of all victims were 15 years old or less.
- Victim sex was 84.4 percent female, while offender sex was 94.1 percent male.
- Nearly 90 percent of all sexual assaults were committed by individuals who were known by the victim, while 10 percent were committed by strangers. For those sexual assaults that were rapes, about 80 percent were committed by persons known to the victims with about 20 percent committed by strangers.

SEXUAL ASSAULT

Summary data on sexual assaults are presented in the following tables and graphs. In the tables below, sexual assaults are shown by degree for all victims, victims 15 and under, and for victims 16 and over. This is because the two most severe degrees of assault, first and second, may be so classified either by the nature of the assault or the age of the victim. Looking only at assaults of victims age 16 and over shows the distribution of assaults by degree based solely on the nature of the assault, not victim age. Most sexual assaults, even some first and second degree assaults, are not rapes according to the Uniform Crime Reporting definition, and this also is shown in the table below.

The seriousness of sexual assaults is also defined, to some degree, by the offense categories used in the Uniform Crime Reporting - Incident-Based system. The more serious types include forcible rape (somewhat more broadly defined than the forcible rape definition on page 39), forcible sodomy, and sexual assault with an object. Remaining sexual assaults of a less serious nature include forcible fondling and statutory rape.

Graphs showing the age and sex of victims and offenders, and relationship between victim and offender, are presented on subsequent pages. Data are also presented on arrests, victim injury, and weapons used in the commission of sexual assaults.

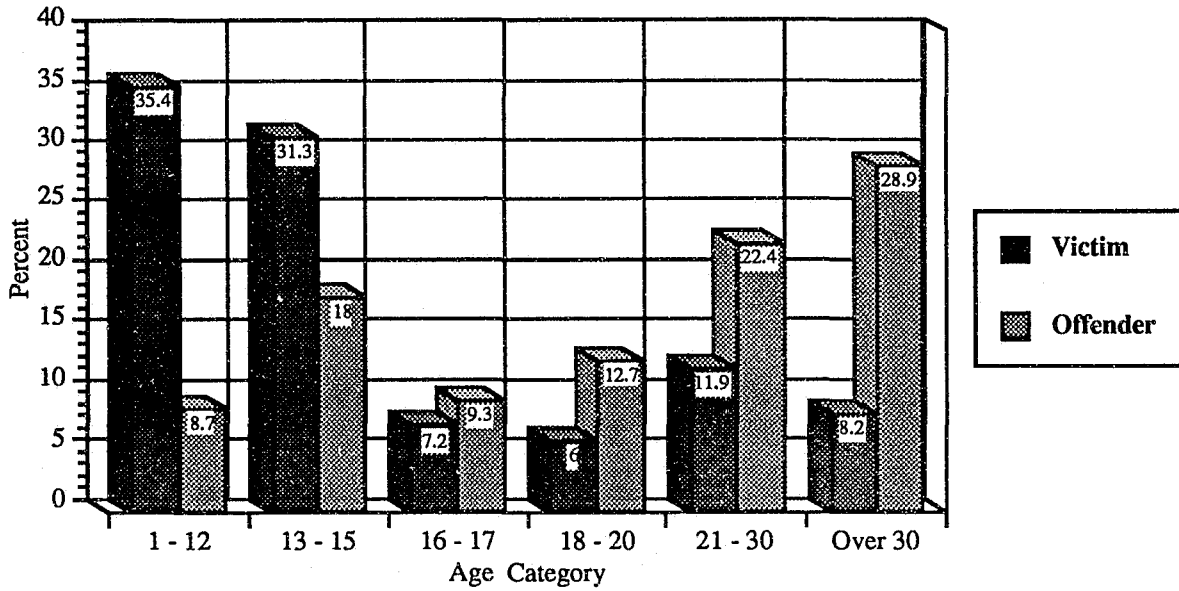

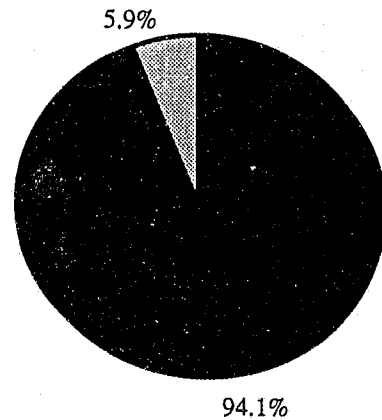

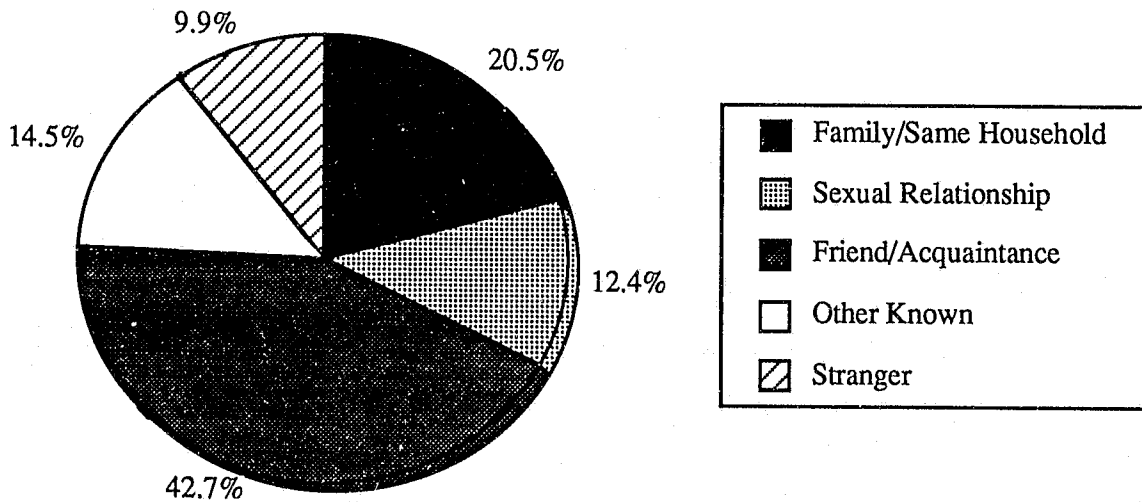

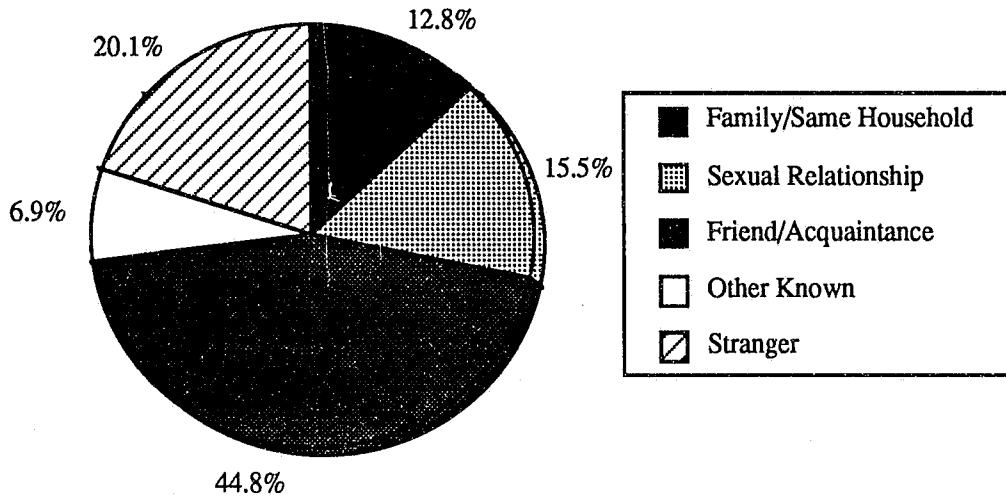

ROBBERY

Definition: Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or putting the victim in fear.

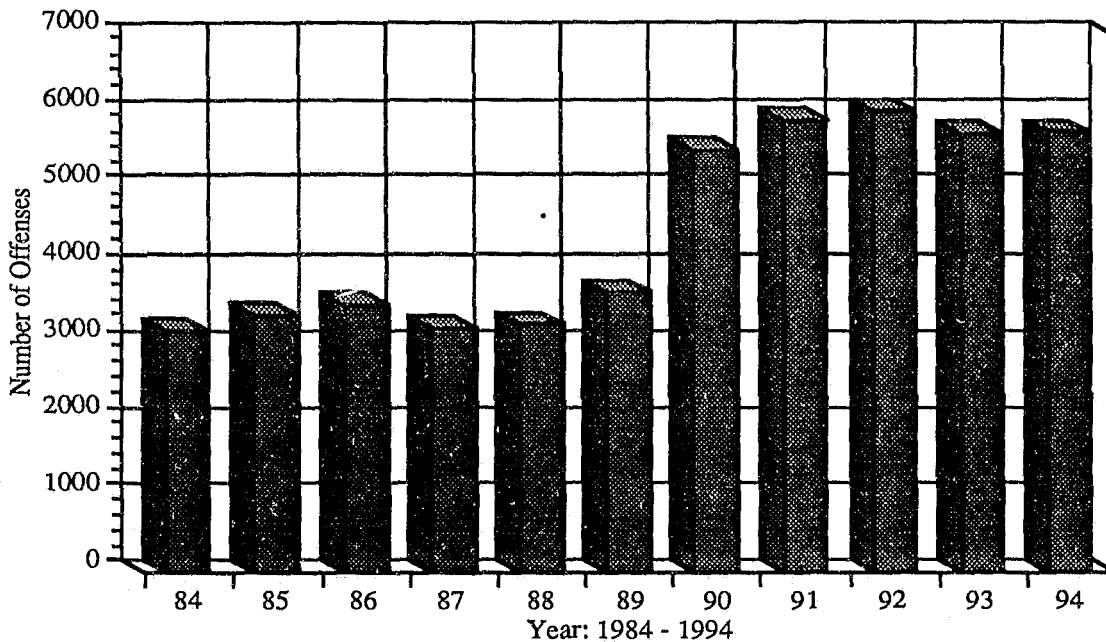
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 5,732 robberies reported in 1994, a 0.4 percent increase since 1993.
- Robbery accounted for 2.8 percent of the total Crime Index and 41.8 percent of all violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one robbery was reported every one hour, 32 minutes in 1994.
- The most frequent month for robbery was December (662), the least frequent was February (407).
- The 1994 robbery rate was 113.2 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, a decrease of 0.5 percent from the 1993 rate of 113.8 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1994 robbery rate of 113.2 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 56 percent less than the 1993 rate of 256 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- The 1994 robbery rates were much greater for those categories of police agencies serving jurisdictions with more than 250,000 residents.
- Robbery rates increased for police agencies serving jurisdictions with between 25,000 and 250,000 residents and those serving cities between 5,000 and 10,000 residents.
- The number of estimated robberies increased 81.4 percent from 1984 to 1994.
- The proportion of robberies carried out with firearms has increased slightly in the past five years, from 50.7 percent in 1990 to 54.5 percent during 1994.
- While highway robberies accounted for 62 percent of all 1994 Wisconsin robberies, they made up 47.8 percent of the total value stolen in all robberies.
- The total dollar value of property stolen in 1994 robberies was \$3,127,429; this represents a 4.3 percent increase from the \$2,998,896 in property stolen in 1993.
- The average value of property stolen in a 1994 robbery was \$546. This figure was 4 percent more than the average value of \$525 in 1993.
- An estimated total of 2,257 persons were arrested for robbery in 1994. Over 69 percent of those arrested were black. In addition, 41 percent were juveniles.
- The robbery clearance rate was 33 percent in 1994, somewhat more than the clearance rate of 31.5 percent during 1993.

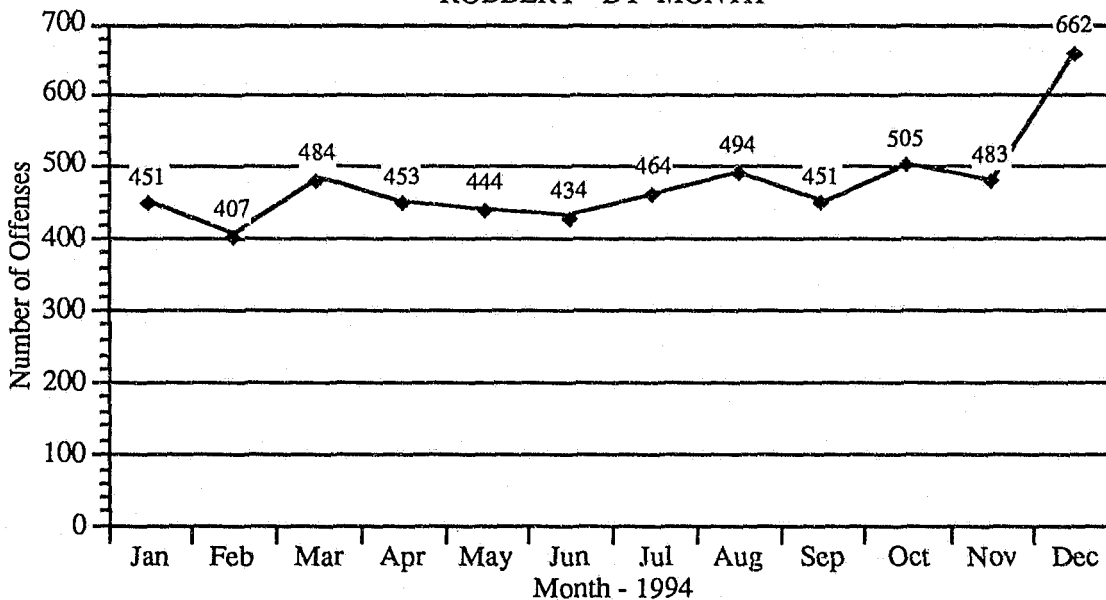

ROBBERY - BY YEAR



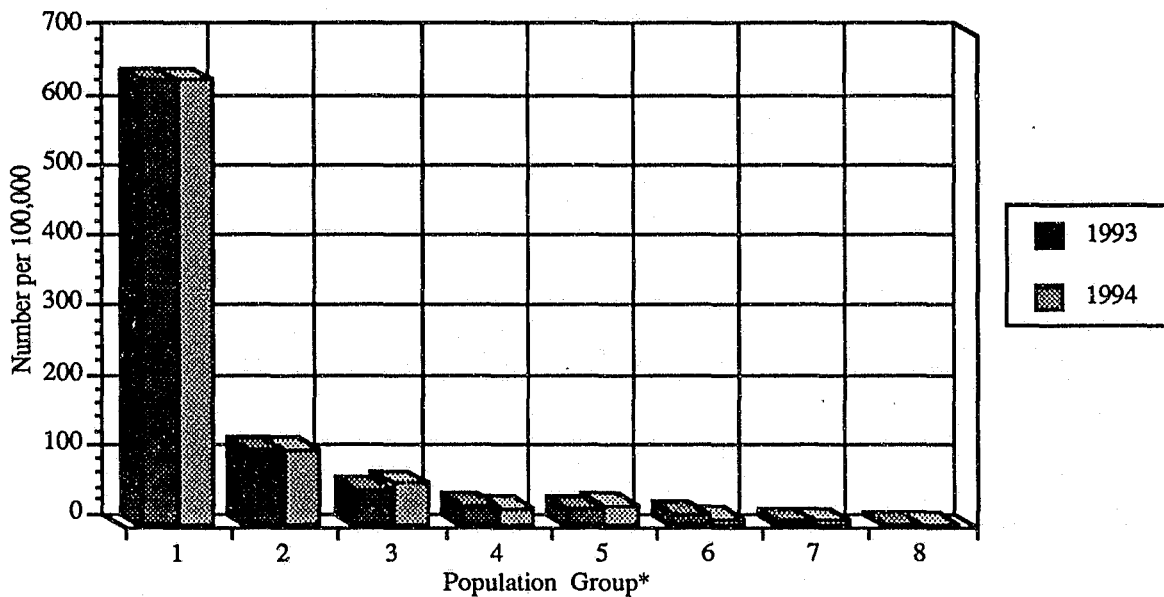
ROBBERY - BY MONTH

ROBBERY RATES



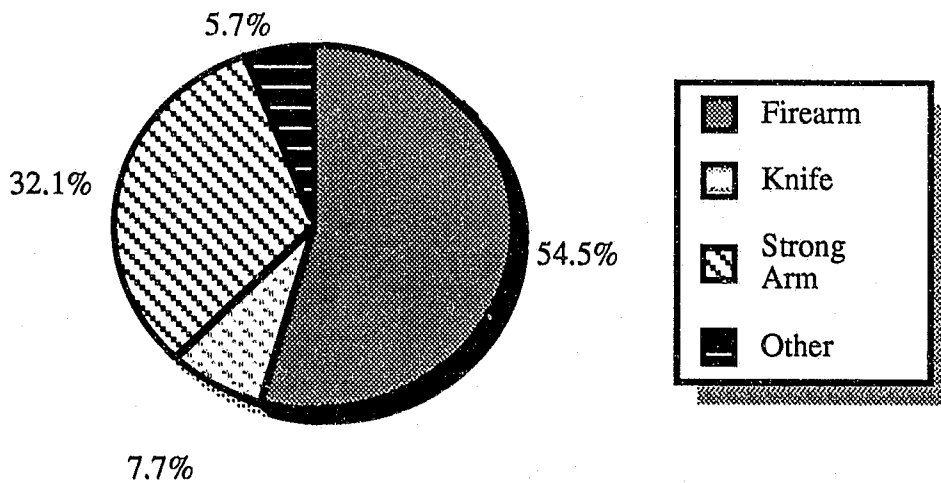

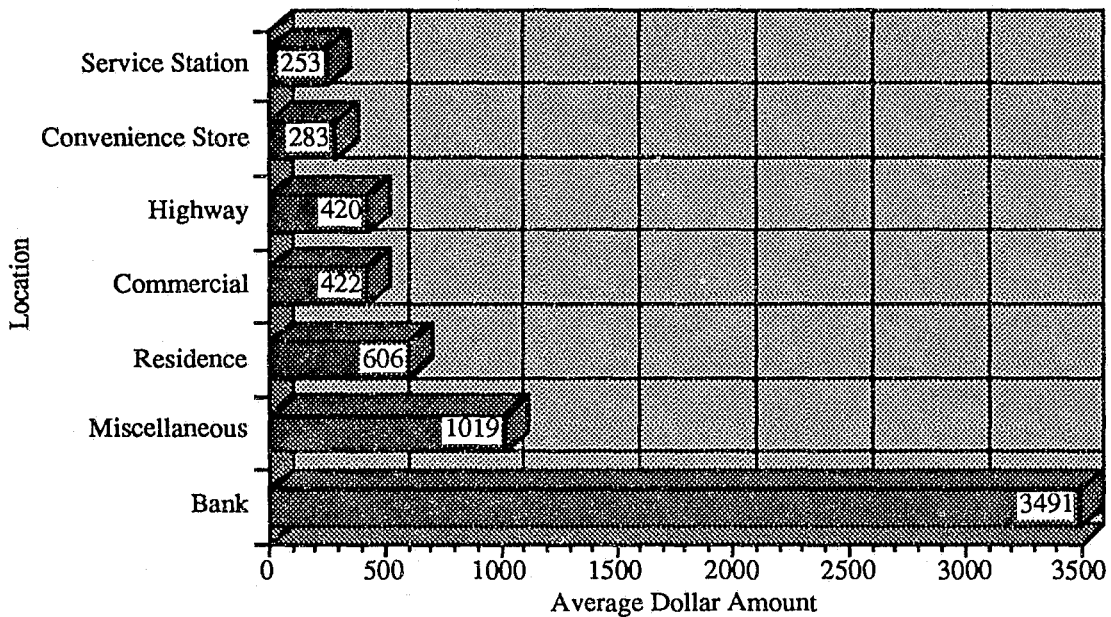
ROBBERY - TYPE OF WEAPON, 1994

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Definition: Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included, since it is not necessary that an injury results when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed.

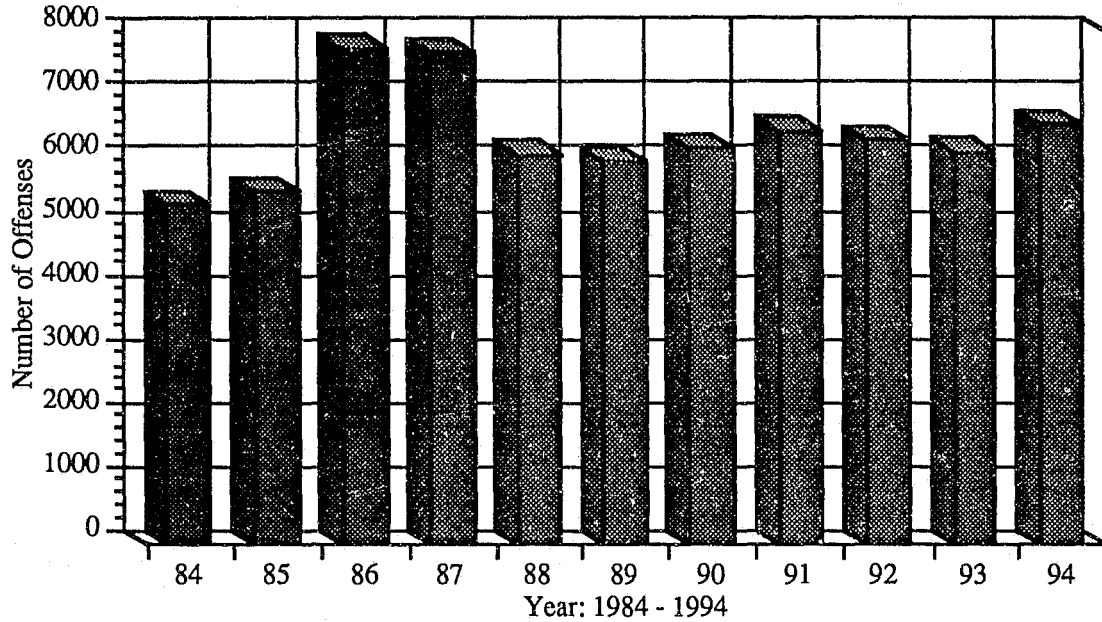
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 6,572 aggravated assaults reported in 1994, a 7.6 percent increase from 1993.
- Aggravated assault accounted for 3.3 percent of the total Crime Index and 47.9 percent of all violent Index Offenses.
- Approximately one aggravated assault was reported every one hour and 20 minutes during 1994.
- The most frequent month for aggravated assault was September (668), the least frequent was January (389).
- The 1994 aggravated assault rate was 129.8 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure represents an increase of 6.7 percent from the 1993 rate of 121.7 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1994 aggravated assault rate of 129.8 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 70 percent less than the 1993 rate of 440 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- There were no consistent patterns in changes in aggravated assault rates for Wisconsin jurisdiction categories during 1994.
- The number of estimated aggravated assaults has increased 23.9 percent from 1984 to 1994. However, the volume of reported aggravated assault increased dramatically in 1986 and 1987, as shown in the graph on the following page. This sharp increase may have been due to enhanced enforcement of domestic violence incidents.
- The proportion of aggravated assaults involving the use of a firearm has remained very stable since 1990.
- An estimated total of 5,615 persons were arrested for aggravated assaults in 1994; nearly 74 percent of those arrested were adults.
- The 1994 total clearance rate for aggravated assault was 69.9 percent, a decrease from the 1993 clearance rate of 71.9 percent.
- There were 36,123 "Other Assaults, - Simple, Not Aggravated" reported in 1994; this figure was 3.4 percent less than the 37,409 simple assaults reported in 1993.
- The clearance rate for simple assault was 82.8 percent in 1994, greater than the 80.6 percent clearance rate in 1993.

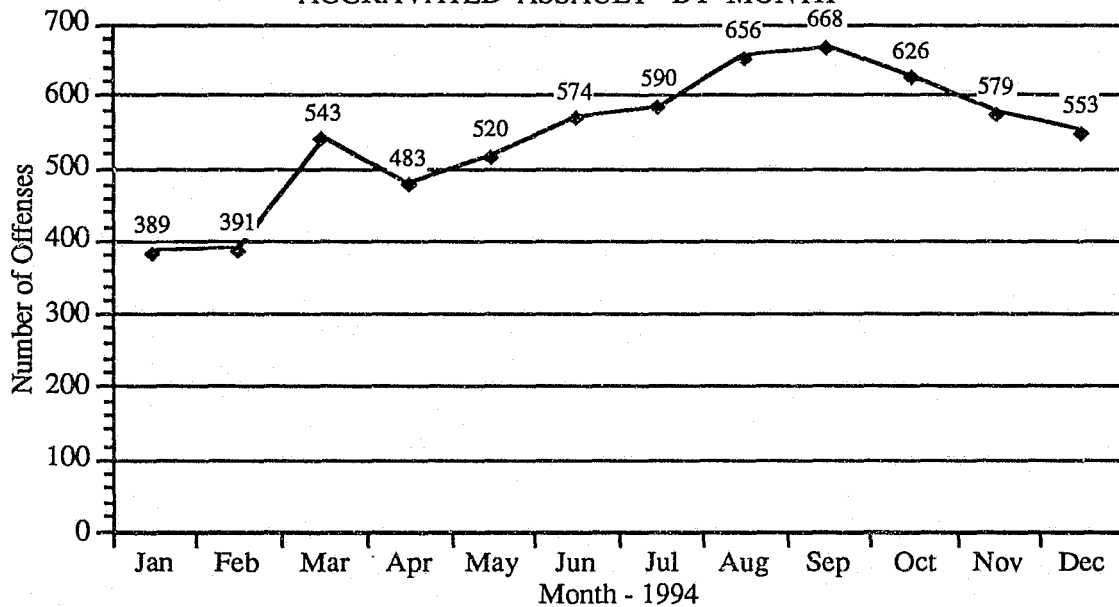

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - BY YEAR



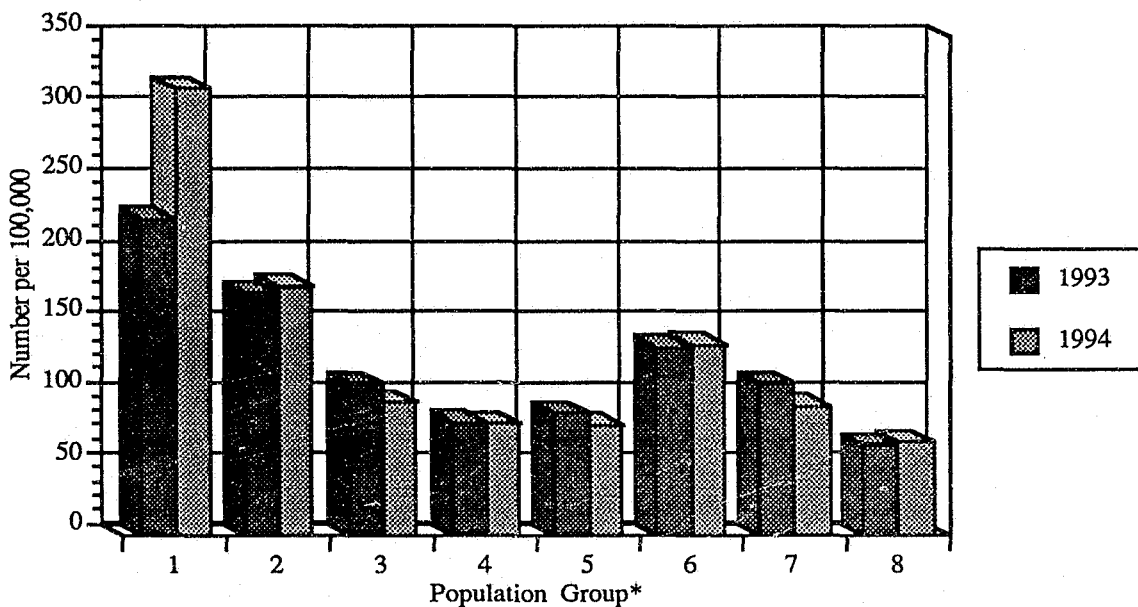
AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - BY MONTH

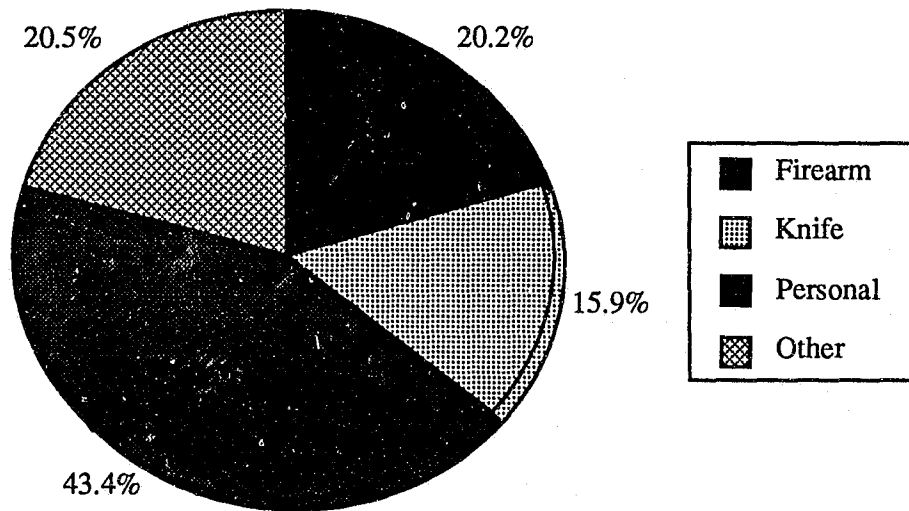

BURGLARY

Definition: Burglary is defined as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as burglary. Burglary in this program is categorized into three subclassifications: forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used, and attempted forcible entry.

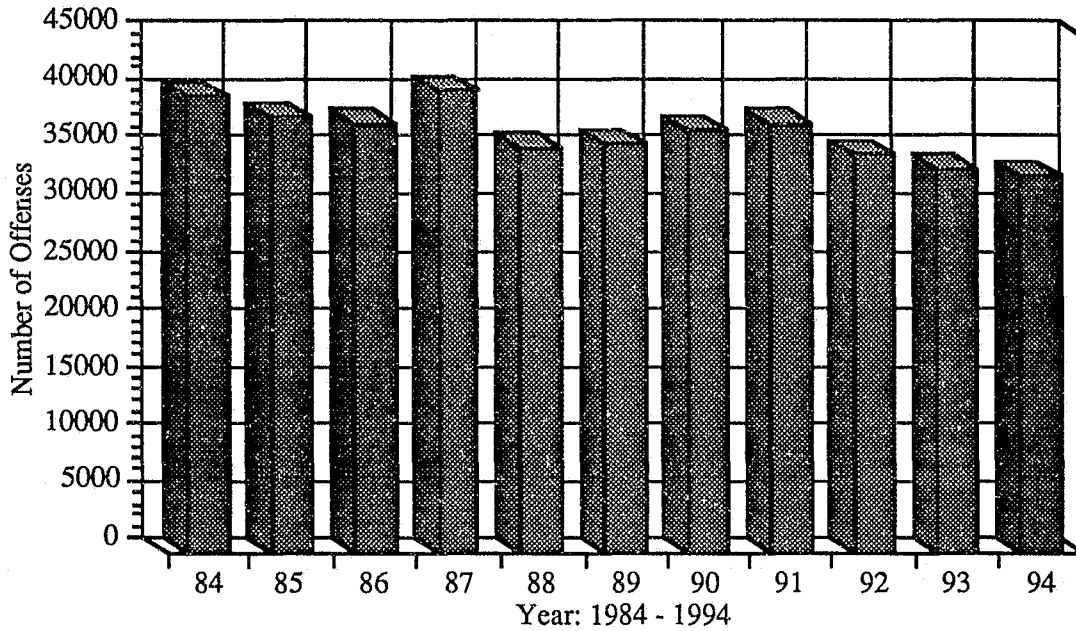
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 32,764 burglaries reported in 1994, a 1.9 percent decrease from 1993.
- Burglary accounted for 16.3 percent of the total Crime Index and 17.5 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- Approximately one burglary was reported every 16 minutes, 2 seconds during 1994.
- The most frequent month for burglary was August (3,376), while the least frequent month was February (1,874).
- The 1994 burglary rate was 647.3 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents. This figure is 2.7 percent less than the 1993 rate of 665.1 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1994 burglary rate of 647.3 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 41 percent less than the 1993 rate of 1,099 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- Burglary offense rates declined for all Wisconsin jurisdiction categories except rural Sheriff Offices.
- The number of estimated burglaries has decreased 17.6 percent from 1984 to 1994.
- The proportions showing type of entry in burglaries were very similar in 1993 and 1994.
- As in previous years, residential burglaries made up nearly two-thirds of all burglaries, both in terms of volume and value of property stolen.
- The average value of property stolen in a 1994 burglary was \$823. This figure is 5 percent less than the 1993 average figure of \$868.
- An estimated total of 6,802 persons were arrested for burglary in 1994. Over 78 percent of those arrested were white and nearly 54 percent were juveniles.
- The burglary clearance rate was 17.3 percent in 1994, a figure slightly more than the 1993 clearance rate of 17.0 percent.

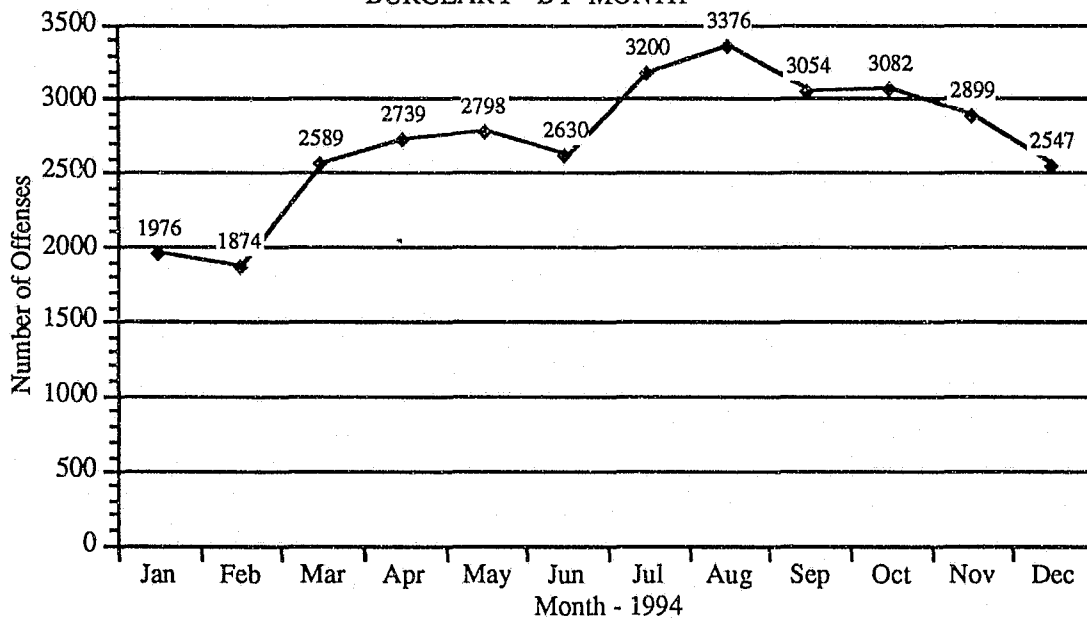

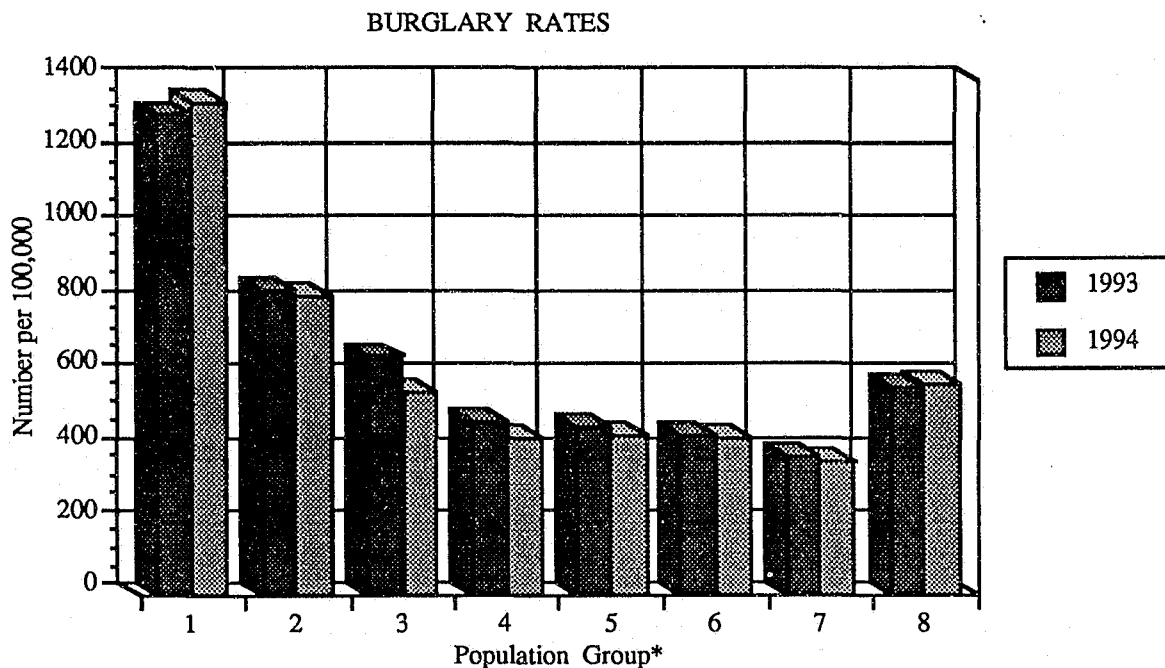


BURGLARY - BY MONTH

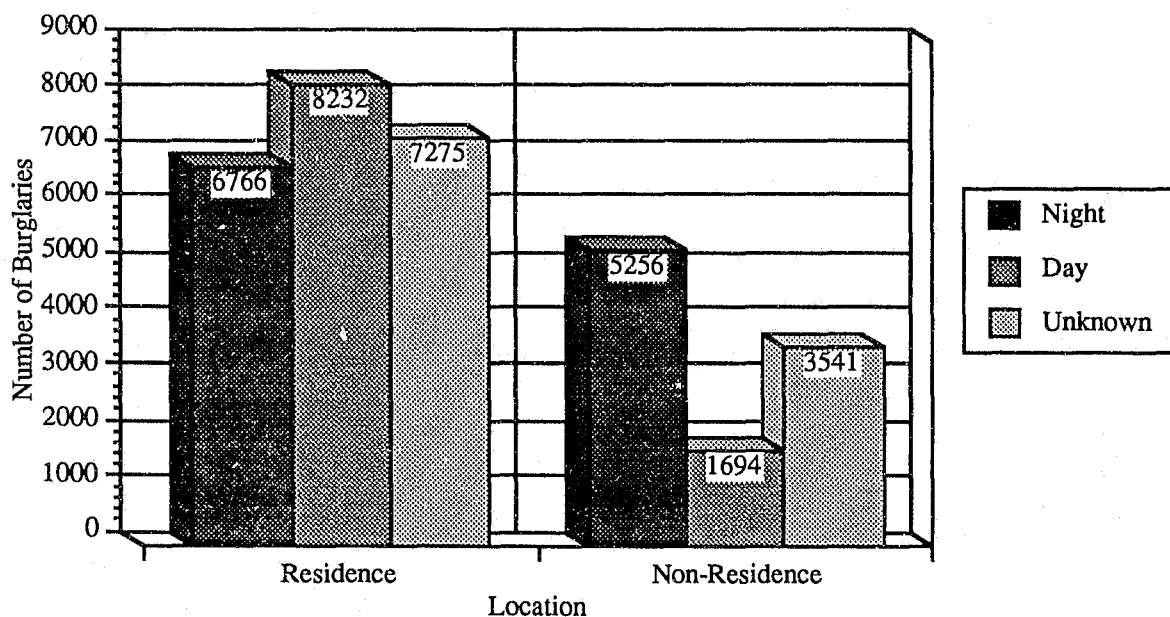

THEFT

Definition: Theft is the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse-snatching, thefts from motor vehicles, thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories, bicycle thefts, etc., in which no use of force, violence, or fraud occurs. In the Uniform Crime Reporting program, this crime category does not include embezzlement, "con" games, forgery, and worthless checks. Motor vehicle theft is also excluded from this category for crime reporting purposes inasmuch as it is a separate Crime Index Offense.

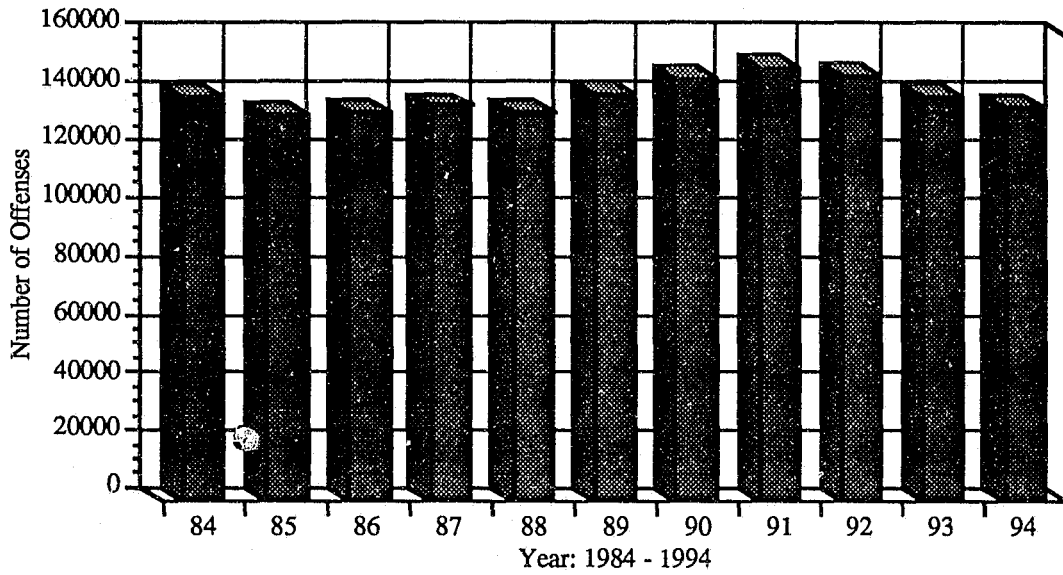
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 135,045 thefts reported in 1994, a 2.8 percent decrease from 1993.
- Theft accounted for 67.1 percent of the total Crime Index and 72 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One theft was reported approximately every three minutes, 54 seconds during 1994.

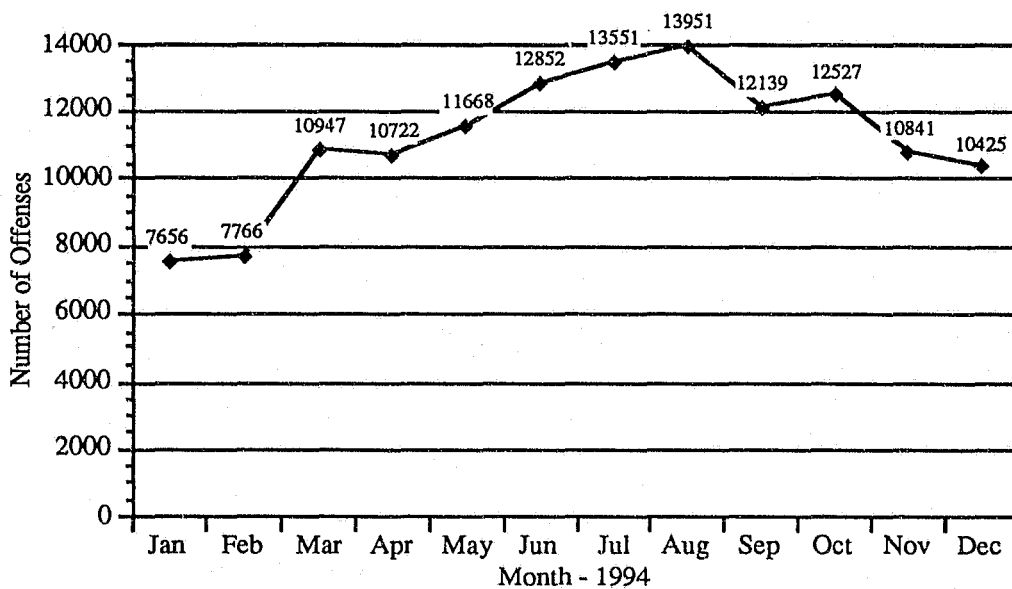

THEFT - BY YEAR

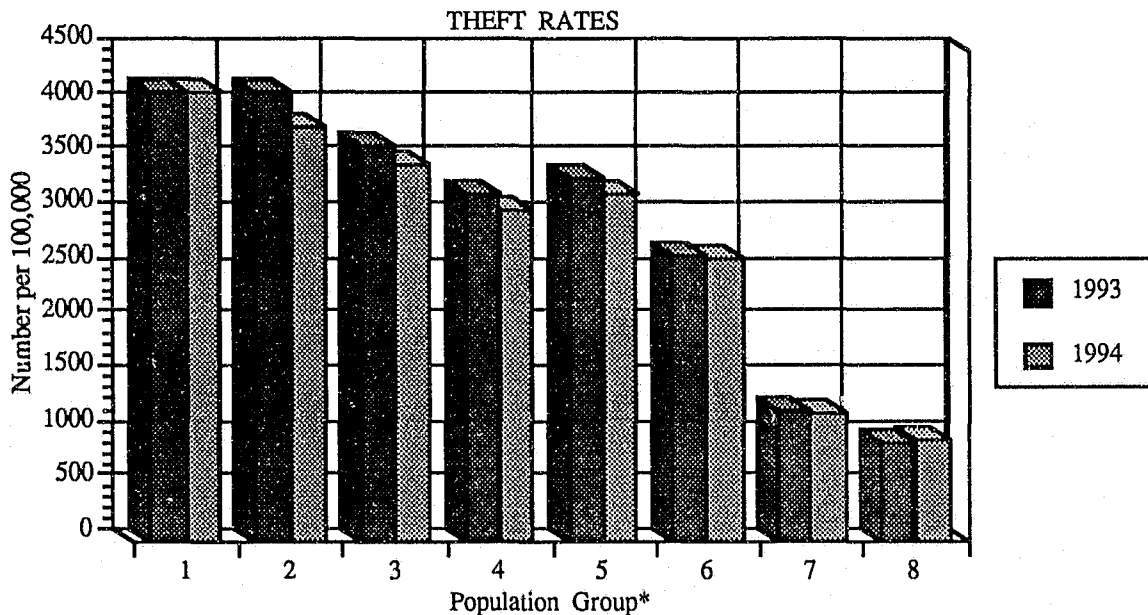


THEFT - BY MONTH

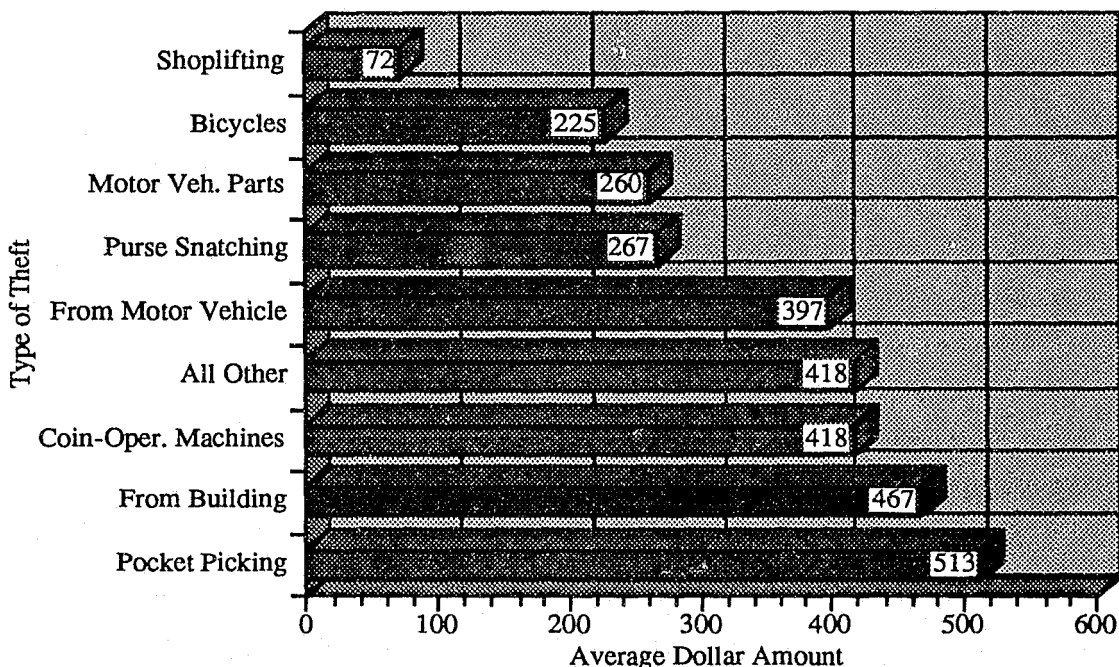

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Definition: Motor vehicle theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. This definition excludes the taking of a motor vehicle for temporary use by those persons having lawful access.

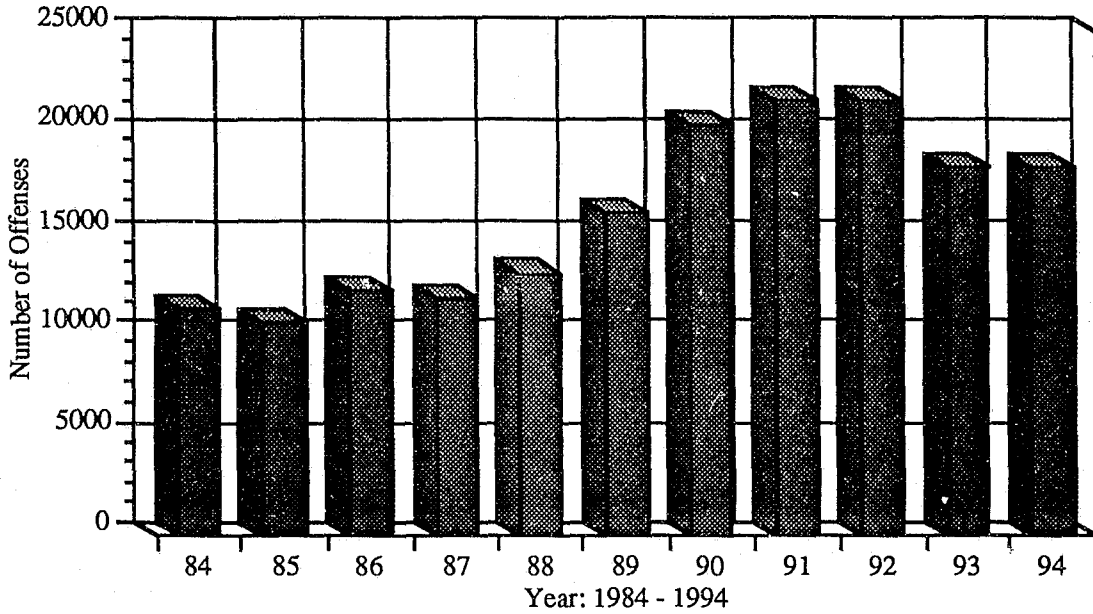
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 18,292 motor vehicle thefts reported in 1994, a 0.3 percent decrease from 1993.
- Motor vehicle thefts accounted for 9.1 percent of the total Crime Index and 9.7 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One motor vehicle theft was reported approximately every 28 minutes, 44 seconds in 1994.
- The most frequent month for motor vehicle theft was October (2,003), the least frequent month was February (1,114).
- The 1994 motor vehicle theft rate was 361.4 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, a 1.1 percent decrease from the 1993 rate of 365.5 per 100,000.
- The 1994 motor vehicle theft rate of 361.4 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 40 percent less than the 1993 rate of 605 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- In terms of the population groupings of Wisconsin jurisdictions, the larger the population category, the greater the rate of motor vehicle theft.
- The number of estimated motor vehicle thefts has increased 53.6 percent from 1984 to 1994.
- The proportion of motor vehicle thefts involving an auto increased slightly, from 87.1 percent in 1993 to 87.4 percent in 1994.
- Nearly 68 percent of the value of stolen motor vehicles was recovered during 1994, a much greater proportion than the 1993 rate of about 56 percent.
- An estimated total of 5,047 persons were arrested for motor vehicle theft during 1994; this figure is 1.7 percent more than the number arrested in 1993.
- Over 63 percent of those arrested for motor vehicle theft in 1994 were juveniles.
- The motor vehicle theft clearance rate was 21.9 percent in 1994, slightly more than the 21.6 percent clearance rate in 1993.

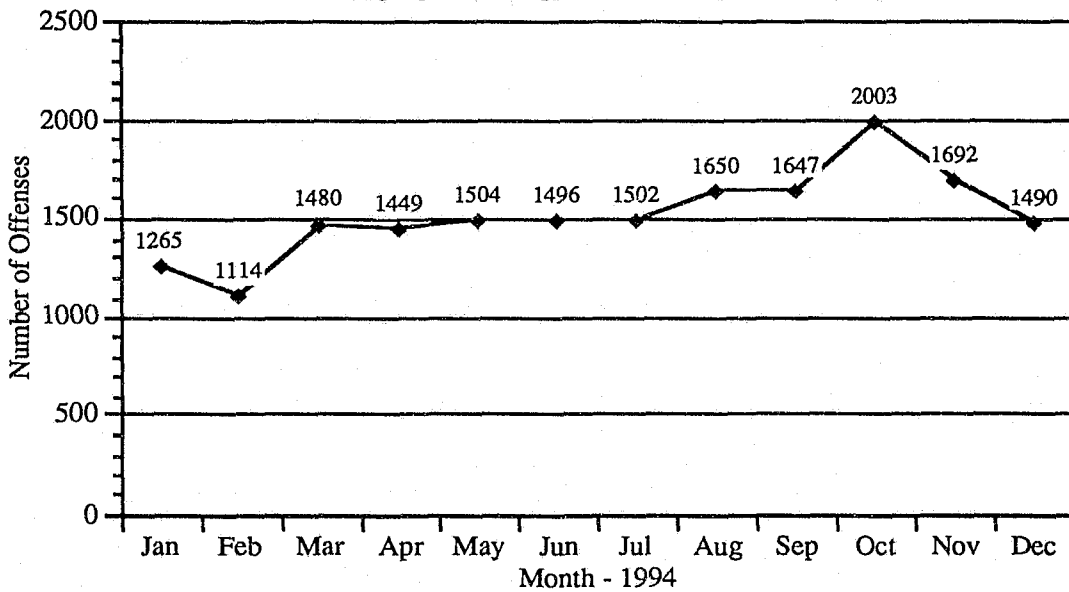

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - BY YEAR



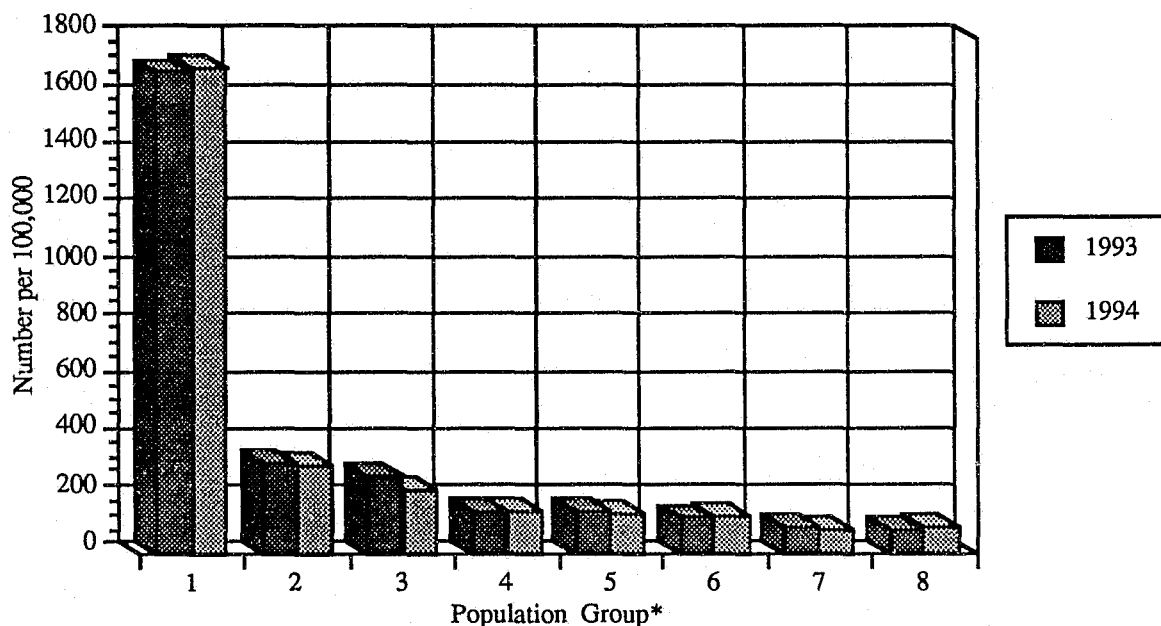
MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - BY MONTH

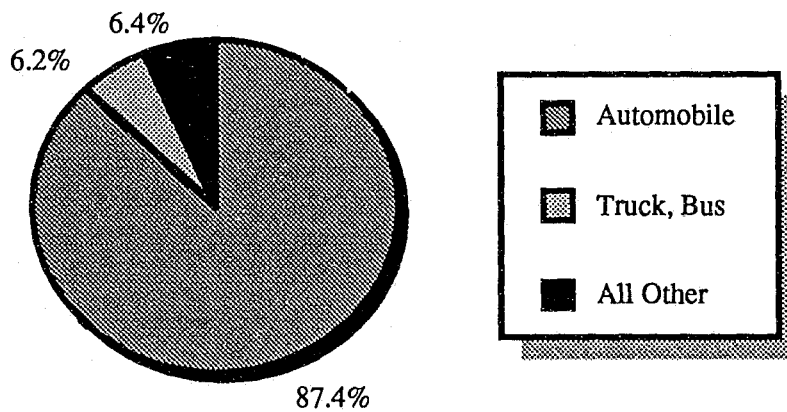

ARSON

Definition: Arson is defined as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknown origins are excluded.

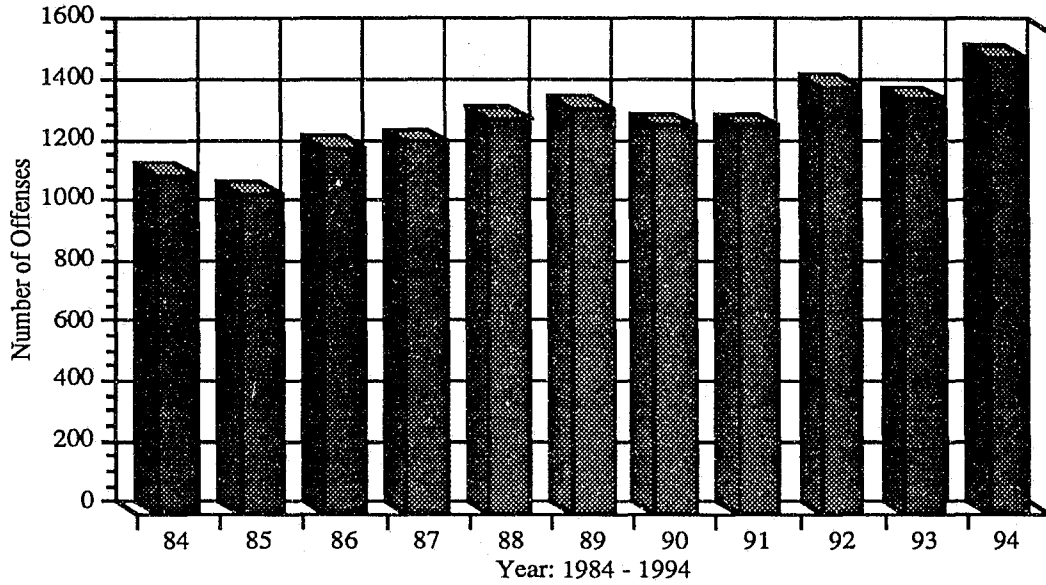
1994 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 1,511 arsons reported in 1994, a 9.6 percent increase from 1993.
- Arson accounted for 0.8 percent of the total Crime Index and 0.8 percent of all property Index Offenses.
- One arson was reported approximately every 5 hours and 48 minutes during 1994.
- The most frequent month for arson was July (176), the least frequent month was February (59).
- The 1994 arson rate was 29.8 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents, an 8.8 percent increase from the 1993 rate of 27.4 per 100,000 residents.
- The 1994 arson rate of 29.8 per 100,000 Wisconsin residents was approximately 35 percent less than the 1993 rate of 46 per 100,000 residents for the nation.
- In terms of the population groupings of Wisconsin jurisdictions, the larger the population category, the greater the rate of arson.
- The total estimated loss from arson was \$17,883,439 in 1994 with an average loss figure of \$11,835. Both figures were much greater than the total loss of \$14,641,356 and average loss of \$10,265 in 1993.
- The total number of estimated arsons has increased by 34.3 percent from 1,125 in 1983 to 1,511 during 1994.
- An estimated total of 611 persons were arrested for arson in 1994, an increase of 11.1 percent in total arson arrests compared to 1993. Over two-thirds of those arrested were juveniles and over 77 percent were white.
- The arson clearance rate was 25.8 percent in 1994, somewhat more than the 25.4 percent clearance rate in 1993.

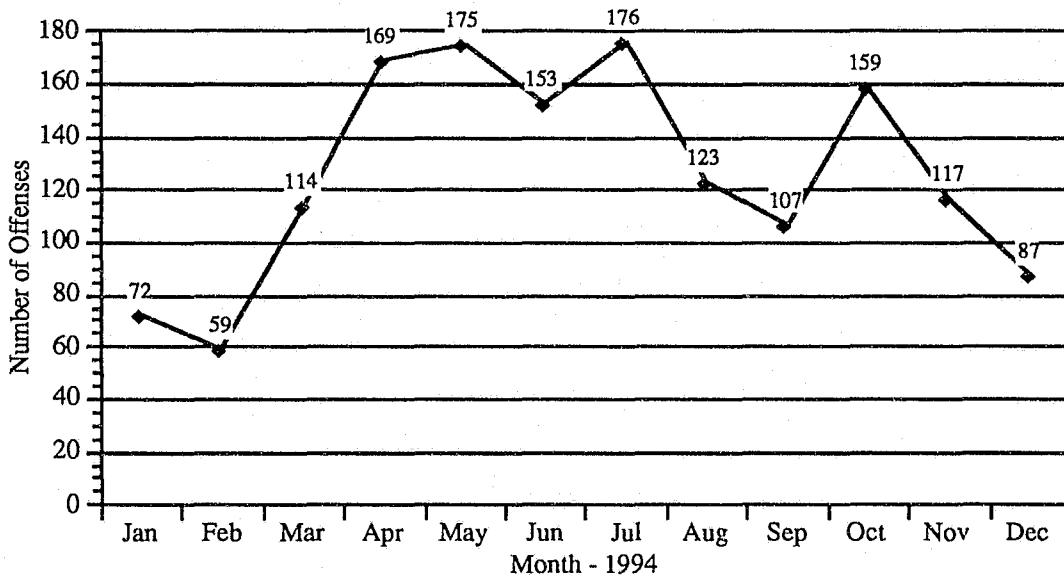

ARSON - BY YEAR



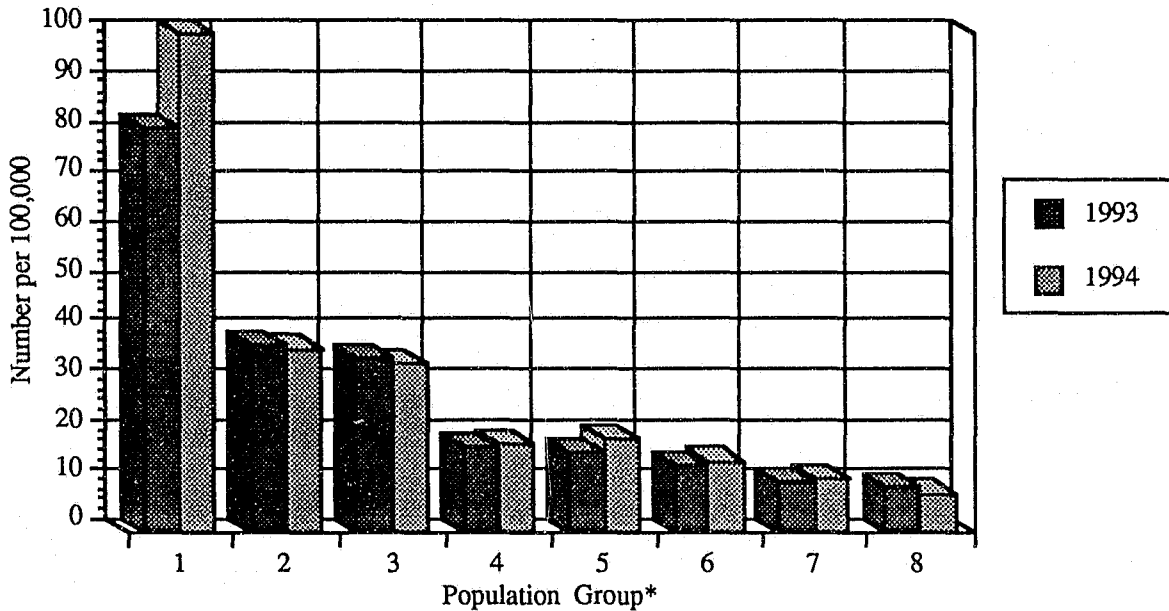
ARSON - BY MONTH

Arson targets showing major increases from 1993 to 1994 included single occupancy residential structures (277 to 377) and storage structures (123 to 184).

While the total of 1,511 arsons reported in 1994 was 9.6 percent more than the 1,378 reported in 1993, total property loss increased by over 22 percent. As a result, the average property loss increased by 11.4 percent, from \$10,625 in 1993 to \$11,835 in 1994.

A major cause of this increase was the two Wisconsin arsons with estimated property losses exceeding \$1,000,000. These targets included an "all other structure" in Waukesha and an "other residential" target in Racine.

Arrest Summary for Selected Non-Index Offenses

Simple Assault

Definition: Simple assault is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were an estimated 27,467 simple assault arrests in 1994, representing a 2.2 percent decrease compared to the 28,080 arrests in 1993.
- Of the total arrests, 79 percent were adults and 21 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of those arrested for simple assault.

Vandalism

Definition: Vandalism is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or person having custody or control.

- There were an estimated 14,151 vandalism arrests in 1994, representing a 3.6 percent increase compared to the 13,657 arrests in 1993.
- Of the total arrests, 48 percent were adults and 52 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 87 percent and females 13 percent of those arrested for vandalism.

Weapon Law Violations

Definition: These offenses include all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were an estimated 7,967 arrests reported for weapon law violations in 1994, representing a 3.8 percent decrease compared to the 8,281 arrests in 1993.
- Of the total arrests, 66 percent were adults and 34 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 85 percent and females 15 percent of those arrested for weapon law violations.

Drug Law Violations

Definition: Drug law violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacture, possession/use of the narcotics and drugs listed below.

- a. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
 - b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
 - c. Synthetic narcotics -- manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (demerol, methadones).
 - d. Other -- dangerous non-narcotic drugs (amphetamines, barbiturates, hallucinogens).
- There were an estimated 16,826 arrests reported for drug law violations in 1994, representing a 32.3 percent increase compared to the 12,714 arrests in 1993.
 - Adults accounted for 82 percent and juveniles 18 percent of the arrests for drug law violations.
 - Males accounted for 85 percent of the arrests and females accounted for the remaining 15 percent.
 - Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted 73 percent of the arrests while the remaining 27 percent were for the sale/manufacture of drugs. By comparison, the possession/use proportion was 71 percent during 1993.
 - Arrests for opium/cocaine accounted for 22 percent of all drug arrests; marijuana arrests accounted for 65 percent of all drug arrests; arrests for synthetic narcotics accounted for 2 percent of all drug arrests; and other dangerous non-narcotic drugs made up 11 percent of all drug arrests. By comparison, opium/cocaine violations represented 25 percent of total drug arrests during 1993.

Fraud

Definition: Included in this category are fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This category includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were an estimated 9,730 arrests reported for fraud in 1994, representing a 7.0 percent decrease compared to the 10,457 arrests in 1993.
- Of the total arrests, 95 percent were adults and 5 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 52 percent and females 48 percent of those arrested for fraud.

Offenses Against Family and Children

Definition: Included in this category are all charges of committing nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family and children.

- There were an estimated 5,191 arrests reported for offenses against family and children in 1994, representing a 13.6 percent increase compared to the 4,571 arrests in 1993.
- Adults accounted for 90 percent of the arrests for offenses against family and children, while juveniles accounted for the remaining 10 percent.
- Males accounted for 72 percent and females 28 percent of those arrested for offenses against family and children.

Driving Under the Influence

Definition: The offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were an estimated 35,026 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 1994, representing a 1.2 percent decrease compared to the 35,468 arrests in 1993.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent of the arrests for driving under the influence, while juveniles accounted for the remaining 1 percent.
- Males accounted for 83 percent and females 17 percent of those arrested for driving under the influence.

Disorderly Conduct

Definition: In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were an estimated 66,180 arrests reported for disorderly conduct in 1994, representing a 3.5 percent increase compared to the 63,957 arrests in 1993.
- Adults accounted for 67 percent of the arrests for disorderly conduct, while juveniles accounted for the remaining 33 percent.
- Males accounted for 78 percent and females 22 percent of those arrested for disorderly conduct.

Liquor Law Violations

Definition: Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of "driving under the influence".

- There were an estimated 35,344 arrests reported for liquor law violations in 1994, representing a 7.0 percent increase compared to the 33,015 arrests in 1993.
- Of the total arrests, 70 percent were adults and 30 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 72 percent and females 28 percent of those arrested for liquor law violations.
- Persons between 18 and 20 years of age accounted for nearly 54 percent of all persons arrested for liquor law violations.

Curfew Law Violations

Definition: In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew ordinances.

- There were an estimated 10,180 arrests reported for curfew violations in 1994, representing a 42.7 percent increase compared to the 7,132 arrests in 1993. Largely due to an anti-burglary program, curfew arrests by the City of Milwaukee Police Department increased by 82 percent from 1,542 in 1993 to 2,810 during 1994.
- Males accounted for 68 percent and females 32 percent of those arrested for curfew violations.

Runaways

Definition: This category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provision of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were an estimated 11,969 runaway arrests reported in 1994, representing a 6.4 percent decrease in arrests compared to 1993.
- Males accounted for 48 percent and females 52 percent of those arrested for runaway violations in 1993.

Statewide Arrests - 1994

The next four tables present statewide figures for each arrest category. As with other state and county level data presented in this report, these tables present estimated data. Note that the state totals in these listings may differ slightly from the corresponding totals shown in Tables 5 through 8. This is because of small differences in the procedure used to make estimates of missing data in the two types of tables. The various offenses chosen to show the highest percentage by sex or race were selected according to two criteria - the highest percentage shown and the total number of arrests for that offense

Statewide Adult Arrests - by Sex

This table shows adults arrested for each offense category by the sex of those arrested. For total adult arrests, 79.5 percent were male and 20.5 percent were female. Arrest categories which had the highest male percentage included Sex Offenses (95%), Burglary (93%), Motor Vehicle Theft (91%), Robbery (90%), Drug Law Violations (85%), Vandalism (85%), OMVWI (83%), and Simple Assault (83%). Arrest categories which had the highest female percentage included Prostitution (62%), Fraud (48%), Forgery (40%), Theft (33%), Offenses Against Family and Children (26%), and Liquor Law Violations (25%).

Statewide Juvenile Arrests - by Sex

This table shows juveniles arrested for each offense category by the sex of those arrested. For total juvenile arrests, 72.3 percent were male and 27.7 percent were female. Arrest categories which had the highest male percentage included Weapon Law Violations (90%), Arson (90%), Burglary (89%), Robbery (88%), Stolen Property (88%), Vandalism (88%), Drug Law Violations (85%), and Sex Offenses (85%). Arrest categories which had the highest female percentage included Runaways (52%), Offenses Against Family and Children (45%), Fraud (40%), Forgery (37%), Liquor Law Violations (36%), and Curfew Law Violations (32%).

Statewide Adult Arrests - by Race

This table shows adults arrested for each offense category by the race of those arrested. For total arrests, 74.6 percent were white, 22.4 percent were black, 2.4 percent were American Indian, and 0.5 percent were Asian. Arrest categories which had the highest white percentage included Liquor Laws (93%), Driving Under the Influence (92%), Sex Offenses (83%), Fraud (83%), and Marijuana Violations (82%). Arrest categories which had the highest black percentage included Robbery (73%), Opium/Cocaine Violations (62%), Prostitution (60%), Motor Vehicle Theft (50%), and Weapon Law Violations (41%).

Statewide Juvenile Arrests - by Race

This table shows juveniles arrested for each offense category by the race of those arrested. For total arrests, 79.6 percent were white, 16.8 percent were black, 2.4 percent were American Indian, and 1.2 percent were Asian. Arrest categories which had the highest white percentage included Driving Under the Influence (96%), Liquor Law Violations (95%), Runaway Violations (89%), Vandalism (86%), Marijuana Violations (85%), and Burglary (84%). Arrest categories which had the highest black percentage included Opium/Cocaine Violations (84%), Robbery (64%), Aggravated Assault (35%), Motor Vehicle Theft (35%), and Simple Assault (34%).

Summary of Offense and Arrest Trends: 1984 - 1994

The following four tables present statewide data for each year from 1984 through 1994 on: (1) the number of Index Offenses, (2) offense rates for Index Offenses, (3) the ratio of arrests to offenses for Index Offenses, and (4) clearance rates for Index Offenses. Each table shows the percent change from 1984 to 1994.

The total number of known Index Offenses in Wisconsin declined from 1984 to 1985, rose in 1986 and 1987, decreased in 1988, increased from 1989 through 1991, then declined through 1994 (see graph, page 14). The number of Index Offenses increased by 0.7 percent for the decade, from 199,860 in 1984 to 201,337 in 1994. However, there was a 5.0 percent decrease in offense rates for the decade since the population of the state increased by about six percent during this period.

The number of violent offenses increased by 46.8 percent for the decade, from 9,350 in 1984 to 13,725 during 1994. However, the number of property offenses decreased by 1.5 percent for the decade, from 190,510 to 187,612. The contrasting patterns in property and violent crime are made clear in the graphs on pages 20 and 26.

Overall, arrest ratios have increased by 25.8 percent over the past decade, indicating that during this time arrests have increased more rapidly than offenses. However, in terms of specific Index Offenses, this is not true of robbery. For this offense, arrests have increased less rapidly than other Index Offenses during the decade. It should be noted that robbery has increased dramatically in the past decade, 81.4 percent from 1984 to 1994.

The clearance rate for total Index Offenses has increased by 20.9 percent since 1984. While clearance rates for total violent crimes decreased slightly, clearance rates for total property crimes have increased dramatically. Among the violent crimes, clearance rates increased during the decade for forcible rape and aggravated assault. However, clearance rates for murder and robbery have decreased. Among the property offenses, clearance rates have increased for burglary and theft, while they have decreased for motor vehicle theft and arson. It should be noted that the clearance rate for total Index Offenses remained fairly stable from 1984 to 1990, although rates have increased considerably since 1990.

Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted

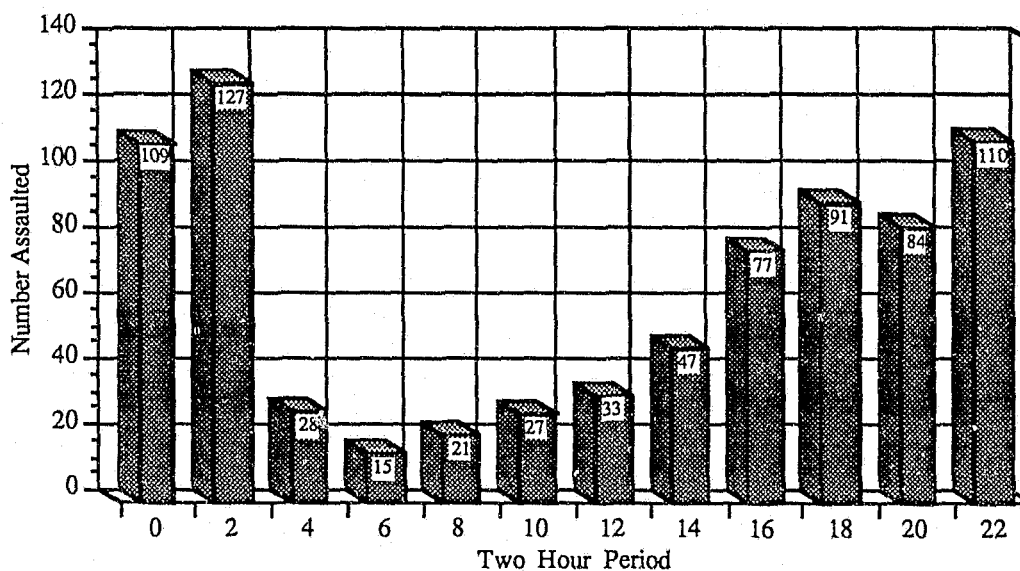
The following tables and graphs present statewide information on law enforcement officers killed or assaulted during 1994. During 1994, six Wisconsin law enforcement officers were killed while in the performance of their duty, including four killed feloniously. The names, law enforcement agencies, and years of service of these six officers are shown on the dedication page in the front of this report.

There were 769 reported assaults on police officers in 1994, a 0.9 percent increase compared to the 762 reported assaults in 1993. Of the 769 reported assaults, 742 or 96.5 percent were cleared. Nearly 63 percent of these assaults occurred during the eight nighttime hours from 8 p.m. through 4 a.m. Injuries resulted from 56.8 percent of 1994 assaults, a decrease compared to the 61 percent of 1993 assaults which resulted in an injury. About 93 percent of assaults involved personal weapons (hands, feet or fists) rather than firearms, knives, or other dangerous weapons. In addition, this section shows both the type of assignment and type of activity when the assault occurred together with the number of assaults on law enforcement officers since 1987.

Personal Injury by Type of Weapon - 1994

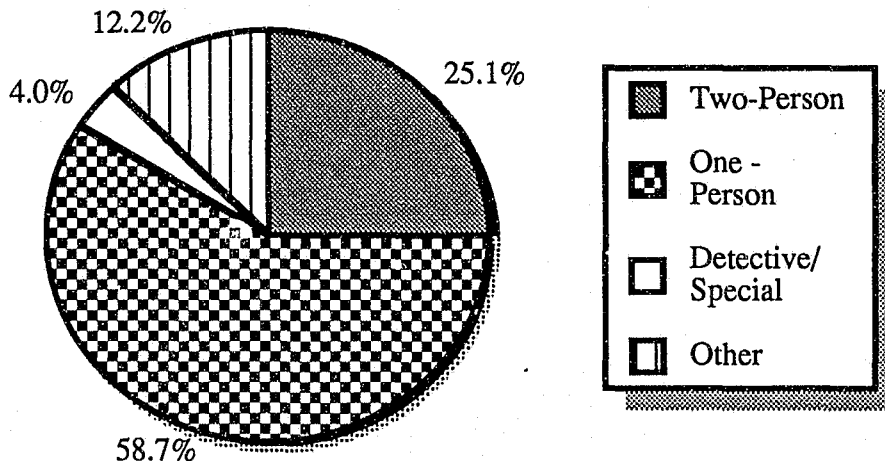

ASSAULT BY TYPE OF ASSIGNMENT

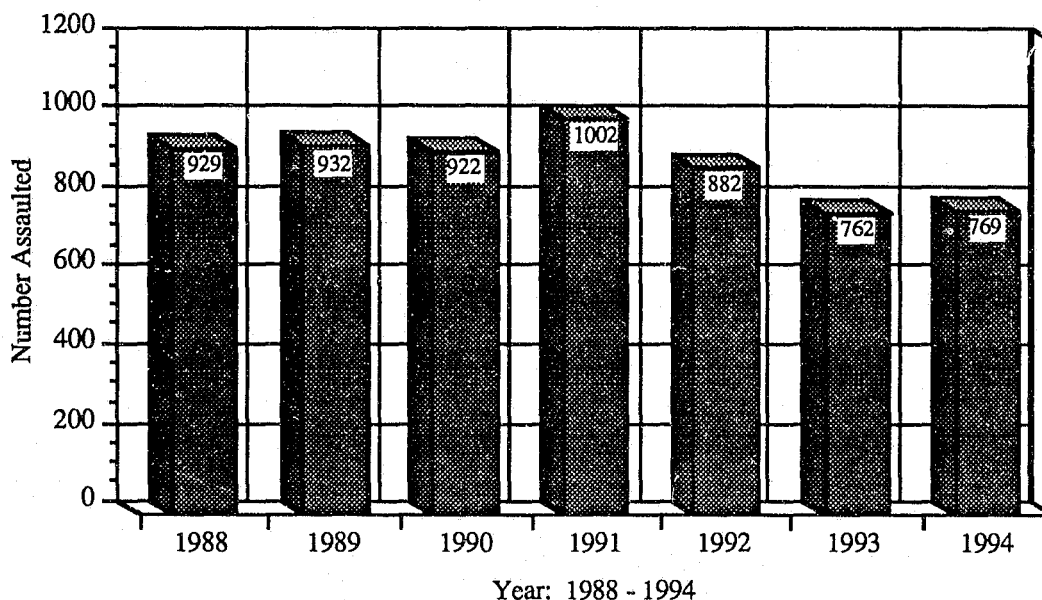

The number of officers assaulted in Wisconsin declined by 17.2 percent from 1988 (929 assaults) to 1994 (769 assaults). After increasing from 1988 through 1991, the number of assaults declined sharply in 1992 and 1993, but increased slightly during 1994.

Index Offenses by County and Law Enforcement Agency - 1994

Table 1. Number of Crime Index Offenses and Percent Change, 1993 - 1994

Table 1 shows Index Offenses for 1993 and 1994 and percent changes from 1993 to 1994 for each reporting jurisdiction. The four violent Index Offenses are totaled to equal violent crimes, and the four property Index Offenses are totaled to equal property crimes. The Crime Index is the sum of all eight offenses.

In Table 1 the number of months of data reported for each jurisdiction is listed. This information is vital to the interpretation of the table, since the data presented are the reported data at the jurisdiction level, even when fewer than 12 months of data were available. Twelve complete months of data were reported by 324 of the 334 law enforcement agencies. Three agencies which began submitting UCR data in 1994 reported less than twelve months of figures. Four other agencies reported less than 12 months of figures and three agencies failed to report any UCR data during 1994 (Portage in Columbia County, Boscobel in Grant County, and Evansville in Rock County).

Data for a jurisdiction which reported for fewer than 12 months in 1994 cannot be directly compared with that jurisdiction's 1993 data or with data for other jurisdictions. Thus, no percent changes are shown for these jurisdictions. However, an approximate comparison can be made using an estimate of the 12 months total. This estimate can be calculated by multiplying the available data by a correction factor which is obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months reported. (For example if nine months of data are available for an agency, the data can be estimated for 12 months by multiplying the data by 12/9 or 1.33.) However, the accuracy of this approximation diminishes when only a few months of data are available. It should be applied with great caution when less than six months of data are available. This method should also be applied with caution when the number of offenses involved is small. For example, if jurisdiction A had 72 thefts in nine months and prorated them to 96 ($12/9 \times 72 = 96$) thefts for the year, while jurisdiction B had three thefts in nine months and prorated them to four thefts for the year, the estimate for jurisdiction A would be more reliable because it had a higher number of offenses.

The percent change in the number of Index Offenses reported from 1993 to 1994 is shown in Table 1 for each jurisdiction for which it was possible to calculate the change. The percent change is calculated using the formula:

$$\frac{(\text{Offenses in 1994}) - (\text{Offenses in 1993})}{\text{Offenses in 1993}} \times 100 = \text{Percent Change}$$

If the number of offenses for 1993 was zero, no percent change was calculated since percent change cannot be calculated from a zero base. In addition, as stated above, no percent change was calculated for a jurisdiction unless 12 months of data were available for both 1993 and 1994.

Table 1 shows county totals for each offense and percent change from 1993 to 1994. For those counties in which not every jurisdiction reported 12 months of data for 1993 or 1994, the county totals shown are estimates. The estimated county totals were obtained by summing the estimated annual totals for each jurisdiction within the county. These estimated annual totals were obtained as described above, by multiplying the available data by a correction factor for jurisdictions with two months or more of 1993 or 1994 data. When estimates are used for county totals, the totals are so labeled in Table 1 (e.g., the notation "(EST)" follows the total for Columbia County).

In addition, there were five new UCR reporters during 1993. These are Pardeeville and Poynette PDs (Columbia County), Princeton PD (Green Lake County), Independence PD (Trempealeau County), and Walworth PD (Walworth County). Also, for each of these agencies, only 1994 data are printed since comparable 1993 figures were not available.

At the end of Table 1, statewide totals of reported offenses in each category and estimates of the actual statewide totals are shown. The statewide estimates were obtained by summing the estimated offenses for each jurisdiction.

Table 2. Offense Rates per 100,000 Population for Index Offenses, 1994

Table 2 presents offense rates per 100,000 population for Index Offenses for each jurisdiction. The populations shown in this table are estimates published by the Demographic Services Center of the Wisconsin Department of Administration. The population shown for each county Sheriff's Office is the total population of the county minus the populations of any municipalities in the county for which UCR data were reported separately. The rates shown in Table 2 are derived by taking the number of reported offenses, shown in Table 1, dividing by the population of the jurisdiction, shown in Table 2, and multiplying by 100,000. These rates permit comparisons among jurisdictions of different sizes. Offense rates for agencies with no permanent residents (e.g., UW Campus agencies, State Patrol, or DNR) are not calculated.

As discussed in connection with Table 1, 12 months of data were available for the vast majority of jurisdictions. Since offense rates based on less than 12 months of data would be misleading, Table 2 presents rates only for those jurisdictions which reported 12 months of data. Agencies with less than 12 months are noted by an asterisk. The countywide and statewide rates shown in Table 2 are based on estimated numbers of offenses when necessary, as described in connection with Table 1.

It should be noted that offenses per 100,000 presented in Table 2 do not represent a projection of crime levels in various locales. Rather, these offense rates are used to enable comparisons of jurisdictions of varying size. However, two points should be kept in mind when analyzing the offense rates in Table 2. First, offense rates for jurisdictions with large numbers of temporary residents (i.e., tourists), such as the Police Departments of Lake Delton, Minocqua, and Wisconsin Dells, are misleading. While all crimes are included in Index Offenses numbers, only permanent residents are used to obtain offense rates. Second, jurisdictions with a large proportion of non-residential crime targets such as the Town of Madison often show inflated crime rates.

Each year when Crime in Wisconsin is published many entities including news media, tourism agencies, and others with an interest in crime compile rankings of cities and counties based on their Crime Index numbers. This simplistic and incomplete analysis often creates improper perceptions which adversely affect cities and counties along with their residents. Assessing criminality and law enforcement's response from jurisdiction to jurisdiction must encompass many elements other than the number or rate of Index Crimes. The transience of the population, its racial and ethnic makeup, its age and sex structure, education levels, and prevalent family structure are all key factors in assessing and better understanding the crime issue. Attitudes of the citizens toward crime and their crime reporting practices, especially concerning more minor offenses, also have an impact on the volume of crimes known to the police. This report provides a statewide view of crime contributed by state and local law enforcement agencies. Population size is the only correlate of crime utilized in this publication. While the other factors noted above are of equal concern, no attempt is made to relate them to the crime data presented. The reader is, therefore, cautioned against comparing statistical data of individual reporting units from cities, counties, or colleges and universities solely on the basis of their population coverage.

Table 3. Total Clearance Rates for Index Offenses, 1994

Table 3 presents total clearance rates by offense and jurisdiction. In Table 3, the various clearance rates are the number of clearances, divided by the number of offenses and multiplied by 100. That is, clearances are presented as a percentage of reported offenses. Note that no clearance rate can be calculated for an offense category if there are no 1994 offenses reported, even though clearances may be reported from prior years. When no offenses have been reported, a blank appears in Table 3. When a clearance rate of zero is shown it means that at least one offense occurred, but that there were no clearances. Also, clearance rates greater than 100 percent are possible (e.g., the forcible rape clearance rate of 200 percent for the Monroe County Sheriff's Office). This occurs when there are clearances of certain offenses which were reported as offenses in earlier years.

Since the clearance rate is the ratio of clearances to reported offenses, it is not particularly sensitive to the problems of missing data described above for Tables 1 and 2. It is reasonable to assume that this ratio would be fairly constant as long as the number of months of data available was reasonably large. Thus, clearance rates have been presented in Table 3 for all jurisdictions for which six months or more of clearance data were present. There were four jurisdictions reporting fewer than six months of data which were excluded from the table. An asterisk (*) is printed next to the name of each of these jurisdictions. Countywide and statewide rates shown in Table 3 are based on estimated clearances and offenses, calculated as described previously in connection with Table 1.

Table 4. Property Stolen, Recovered and Damaged by Arson, 1994

Table 4 shows the value of property stolen, recovered and damaged by arson for each county and law enforcement agency reporting UCR data. All values shown in Table 4 are reported data; no estimates are performed on partial or missing figures. The property figures include property stolen or recovered during 1994. In some instances, property recovered during 1994 was stolen in a previous year.

Prior to the 1988 Annual Crime and Arrests Report, Table 4 presented the percentage of total clearances involving only juveniles. However, both because this measure minimized juvenile involvement in clearances and a relative lack of interest in these data, this table was replaced in the 1988 UCR report. However, some juvenile clearance figures for individual agencies are available upon request.

Arrests by County and Law Enforcement Agency - 1994

Tables 5 through 8 present data on adults and juveniles arrested by Wisconsin law enforcement agencies during 1994. The tables present the total number of arrests, the total number of Part I and Part II arrests, and the number of arrests for each Part I and Part II offense separately, for each reporting agency. Information on adults is presented in Tables 5 and 7, information on juveniles in Tables 6 and 8.

As indicated in the introduction to this report, data are not available for all 12 months of 1994 for every reporting agency. In the following tables, as in Tables 1 through 4, the number of months of data available for each reporting agency is listed. Although only the known data are presented for each jurisdiction, an estimated yearly total can be calculated for any jurisdiction with less than 12 months of data reported. The estimated totals can be calculated by multiplying the number in the table by a correction factor which can be obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months of data reported. (Thus, if 11 months of data are presented for an agency, for example, the agency's figures should be multiplied by 12/11, or 1.09). As is the case in other tables, the more months of data reported, the more accurate will be the yearly estimates. Estimates based on a small number of months of reported data should be interpreted cautiously. This estimation procedure should also be applied with caution when the number of arrests is small.

The following tables show, for each county, county total arrests for each offense. For those counties in which not every jurisdiction reported 12 months of data for 1994, the county totals shown are estimates. These estimates were obtained as in Table 1, by calculating and summing the estimated annual total for each jurisdiction within the county. As in the previous table, when estimates are used for county totals, the notation "(EST)" follows the "County Total" label.

At the end of each table there are statewide totals of the reported arrests in each category and estimates of the actual statewide totals. The estimated totals were obtained by calculating the estimated yearly totals, as described above, for each reporting agency with less than 12 months of data and summing the estimates for these agencies and the reported figures for the other agencies.

These tables also contain population figures for each jurisdiction. Tables 5 and 7 contain adult population figures. Tables 6 and 8 contain juvenile population figures. These adult and juvenile figures were derived from the Department of Administration (DOA) population estimates, Official Population Estimates for 1994, using adult and juvenile population proportions provided in the 1990 census. The population figures presented for county sheriffs' offices are the county populations minus the populations of any municipalities in the county for which UCR data are reported separately. These figures can be used to calculate arrest rates for any of the jurisdictions in the State. The population of those jurisdictions which span two or more county borders are assigned to the county in which the majority of the population resides. Arrest rates are calculated by dividing the number of arrests by the relevant population and multiplying the result by 100,000. This rate per 100,000 is comparable across jurisdictions of varying sizes.

Appendix I

Glossary

ADULT: A person 18 years of age or older.

ARREST: Taking into physical or other legal custody for commission of an offense in the local reporting jurisdiction. An arrest has occurred when a law enforcement officer detains a person with the intention of seeking charges against them for a specific offense and a record is made of the detention (see p. 60, Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook). Arrests for all criminal offenses are scored. Arrests for ordinance violations are included. Arrests for traffic offenses, with the exception of driving under the influence of intoxicants, are not scored. Included are those persons released without having been formally charged. (See Juvenile Arrest.)

ARREST RATE: The number of arrests for a particular offense, or group of offenses, per 100,000 population. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Arrests}}{\text{Population}} \times 100,000$$

Arrest rates per population unit are employed to remove the effects of differing sizes of law enforcement service areas, permitting the examination of arrest on an equalized population basis. "Per 100,000 population" is generally utilized to preclude rates for infrequently occurring arrests from being expressed as very small numbers.

CLEARANCE: An offense is cleared, or solved for crime reporting purposes, when at least one person is arrested, charged with commission of the offense and turned over to the court for prosecution. Provision is also made for clearance in certain "exceptional" situations (see p. 42, Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook.)

CLEARANCE RATE (TOTAL): The number of clearances divided by the total number of offenses, expressed as a percent. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Clearances}}{\text{Number of Offenses}} \times 100\%$$

Offenses are reported as they become known to law enforcement agencies. Clearances are scored as they are made. Therefore, it is possible for the clearance rate to exceed 100 percent for a time period. Both clearances by arrest and exceptional clearances are included.

CRIME FACTORS: Historically, the causes and origins of crime have been the subjects of investigation by many disciplines. No definitive conclusions have yet been reached; many factors affect the volume and type of crime that occurs from place to place. Caution should, therefore, be exercised in comparing statistical data of individual communities or counties solely on the basis of their populations.

More appropriate use can be made of the statistics by relating the experience of a particular area to group averages, or by employing a ranking procedure, and encompassing both crime and other socioeconomic information.

CRIME INDEX: The total of eight serious offenses used as an indicator of crime. Crime Index offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft and arson. The first four of these are referred to as violent crimes, and the latter four as property crimes. Definitions of each of these offenses are given in the section "Statewide Index Offenses and Arrests".

JUVENILE: A person 17 years of age or younger.

JUVENILE ARREST: For purposes of Uniform Crime Reporting, a juvenile should be counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult, an arrest would be tallied (see Uniform Crime Reporting Manual, p. 60). When a law enforcement officer places a juvenile in custody for a specific offense, including status offenses, an "arrest" is scored. Law enforcement contacts with juveniles where no offense has been committed are not scored as arrests. Juveniles taken into custody for their own protection, such as in neglect cases, are not scored as being arrested if they have not committed an offense. (See Arrest)

Under Wisconsin Law s. 48.19 (3), juveniles "taken into custody" to investigate an alleged violation are not considered "arrested". However, the UCR Program uses the term "arrest" for both adults and juveniles to describe apprehension. This report, based upon UCR data, also uses the term "arrest" in this latter sense.

JUVENILE CRIME: The only measure of juvenile crime available through Uniform Crime Reporting is the number of juvenile arrests (number, rate, and percentage of total arrests).

OFFENSE RATE: The number of known offenses per 100,000 population. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Offenses}}{\text{Population}} \times 100,000$$

Offense rates per population unit are employed to remove the effect of differing sizes of law enforcement service areas, permitting the examination of reported crime on an equalized population basis. "Per 100,000 population" is generally utilized to preclude the rates for infrequently occurring offenses from being expressed as very small numbers.

More specific crime or victimization rate measures may also be utilized, such as residential burglaries per 100,000 residences, motor vehicle thefts per 100,000 registered vehicles, or forcible rapes per 100,000 females in typically victimized age groups.

PART I OFFENSES: The eight index crimes plus manslaughter by negligence.

PART II OFFENSES: All crime categories not already designated as Part I, excluding all traffic violations except Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated.

PERCENT CHANGE: The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Value in Current Period} - \text{Value in Base Period}}{\text{Value in Base Period}} \times 100\%$$

POPULATION: Totals as well as juvenile and adult subtotals are based on Official Population Estimates for 1994, Demographic Services Center, Wisconsin Department of Administration.

STATUS OFFENSES: Offenses which are only offenses when they are committed by a juvenile. For purposes of the Wisconsin UCR Program, status offenses consist of curfew violations, runaways, and liquor law violations.

Appendix II

The Use of UCR Statistics by Local Agencies

A. INTRODUCTION

The graphs and tables which follow illustrate some of the potential uses of the UCR report. The examples in this report are drawn from special reports done for individual agencies during the past year. These special reports usually summarize UCR data for two to five years and are generally used for budgetary purposes or are included in the annual report of a law enforcement agency.

The various tables in the second half of the annual report contain various crime/arrest figures for all reporting jurisdictions together with statewide figures. In addition, offense rate figures for violent crime (page 21 of the 1994 Annual UCR Report) and property crime (page 27) allow law enforcement agencies to compare their crime rates with agencies of similar size throughout Wisconsin.

Several points should be noted with regard to the use of UCR figures --

1 - Crime and arrest figures from past years can be obtained from earlier UCR reports or by contacting Tom Eversen at the Wisconsin UCR Program in Madison (608) 266-7644. These figures are available as far back as 1970. However, specific crime and arrest details may not be consistent for each year.

2 - Numbers and percentage changes can vary widely over time either due to the relatively small numbers involved (e.g., murder or arson) or changes in state statutes (e.g., increase in the legal drinking age).

3 - **Care should be taken when comparing the figures of one agency to those of another.** For example, a large number of tourists (Lake Delton or Wisconsin Dells) can inflate the crime rate. Also, individual agency policies or increased enforcement of certain local ordinances (e.g., curfew laws) may affect the number of arrests.

Note: The jurisdiction tables from the 1994 Annual UCR Report are capitalized in bold (e.g., **TABLE 1**).

B. OFFENSES REPORTED

TABLE 1 in the 1994 Annual Report (pages 102 to 117) can be used to obtain two years of crime figures. Numbers from earlier years can be obtained from previous UCR reports.

Example 1 - Crime Totals (2 years)

Table A compares the number of Part I crimes reported to the **Appleton Police Department** during 1993 and 1994.

Total reported Index crime decreased by fifteen percent in 1994, largely due to major creases in each of the Property crimes.

Example 2 - Crime Totals (5 years)

Table B shows the number of Index offenses (also known as Part I crimes) reported to the **Baraboo Police Department** from 1990 through 1994. Again, figures for years prior to 1994 can be obtained either from earlier editions of the Annual Crime and Arrest Report or by contacting the Wisconsin UCR Program.

Total Index crime decreased by 14.6 percent during the five year period, largely due to decreases in burglary, motor vehicle theft, and theft. While violent crime increased by 16.7 percent during the five year period, reported property crime decreased by 15.4 percent.

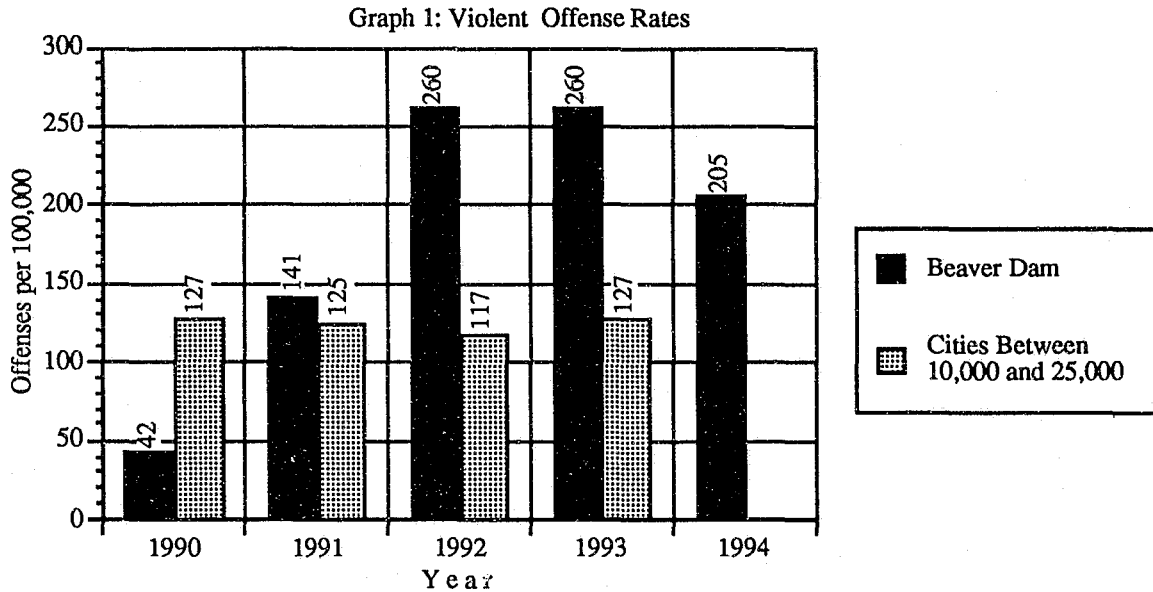
The large percentage changes in various offense categories underscore the need to present both percent figures and actual numbers. For example, the 16.9% decrease in theft over the five year period may be more significant than the 16.7% increase in Violent crime during the same period.

C. OFFENSE RATES

TABLE 2 in the 1994 Annual Report (pages 118 to 125) is used in order to obtain the offense rate per 100,000 residents for an agency. Crime rates per 100,000 are used to permit the comparison of jurisdictions with different population levels. Figures for categories of jurisdictions of similar size can be seen on pages 21 (Violent Crime) and page 27 (Property Crime) of the 1994 Annual Report.

Example 1 - Offense Rates (Violent Crime)

Graph 1 presents offense rates per 100,000 population for violent Index offenses. Rates are presented for the **Beaver Dam Police Department** and for all Wisconsin cities between 10,000 and 24,999 residents for purposes of comparison.

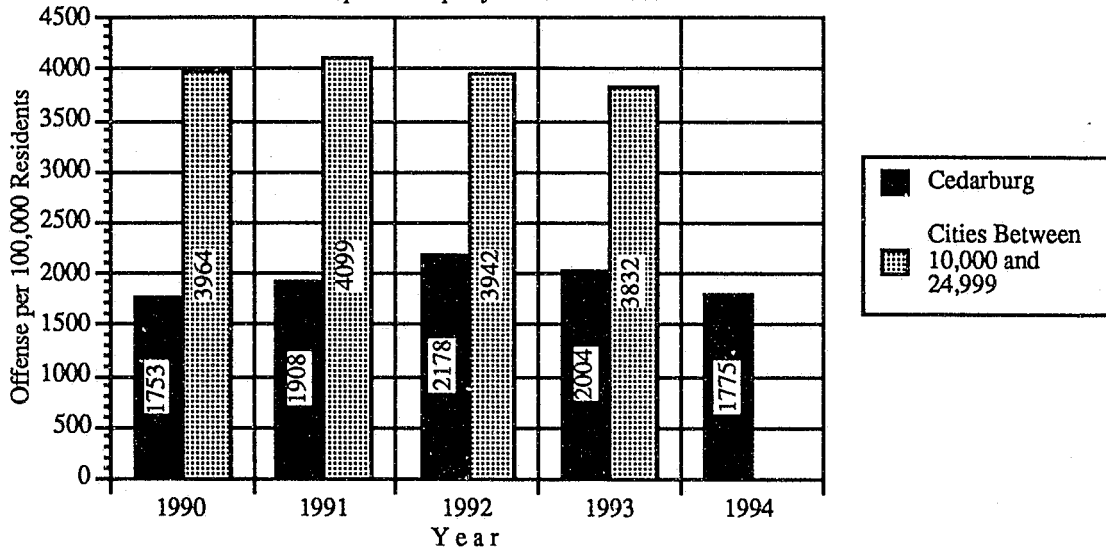


While the violent offense rates in Beaver Dam were less than the average of other cities in Wisconsin of similar size in 1990, they have been greater than those of similar cities since 1991.

Example 2 - Offense Rates (Property Crime)

Graph 2 presents similar information on property crime offense rates for the **Cedarburg Police Department** and include the average rates for cities of comparable size. Again, figures are shown for each of the past five years.

Graph 2: Property Offenses Rates



Property offense rates in Cedarburg have been much less than the average rates in cities of similar size in Wisconsin.

D. CLEARANCES

TABLE 3 (pages 126 to 133) in the 1994 Annual Report shows clearance rates for individual jurisdictions. It should be noted that clearance rates are usually lower in Sheriff's Offices than in Police Departments because of the relative isolation of many of the crime targets in more rural areas.

Example 1 - Clearance Rates

Information in Table C shows the clearance rates for the **Stoughton Police Department** for Total Index, Violent Index, and Property Index crimes for the past five years. Statewide clearance rates for 1994 are included for purposes of comparison.

Stoughton clearance rates have been greater than Statewide clearance rates during the past five years.

E. PROPERTY LOST AND RECOVERED

TABLE 4 (pages 134 to 141) in the 1994 Annual Report shows the total value of property stolen and recovered for each jurisdiction together with the total value of property lost in arson cases. More detailed information on the various types of property can be obtained from the State UCR Program. The percentage of property recovered often depends upon the type of property stolen. For example, certain property such as motor vehicles are much more likely to be recovered than either jewelry or currency.

Example 1 - Property Stolen and Recovered

Table D shows the value of property stolen and recovered for the Eau Claire County Sheriff's Office during 1994. As noted above, this more detailed property information can be obtained from the State UCR Program.

The percentage of property recovered in 1994 (55.6%) is much greater than both the 1993 Eau Claire County Sheriff's recovery rate of 38.3% and the estimated 1994 Statewide recovery rate of 38%.

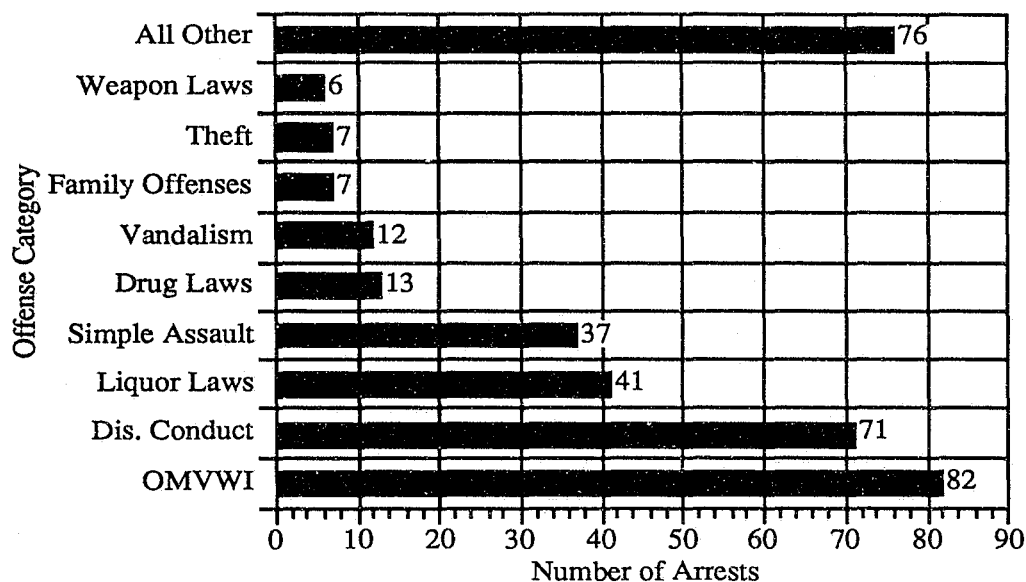
F. ARRESTS

Adult arrests are shown in TABLE 5 (pages 144 to 151) and TABLE 7 (pages 160 to 175) of the 1994 Annual Report. Juvenile arrest figures are shown in TABLE 6 (pages 152 to 159) and TABLE 8 (pages 176 to 191) of the 1993 Annual Report. TABLES 5 and 6 present arrest totals for all Part I Crimes (eight Index crimes plus negligent manslaughter) in addition to the number of total arrests and Part II arrests. TABLES 7 and 8 present arrest totals for each Part II offense together with more detailed totals on drug-related arrests.

Example 1 - Adult Arrests (1 year)

Graph 1 shows the number of adults arrested in 1994 by the Altoona Police Department for the most common offense categories.

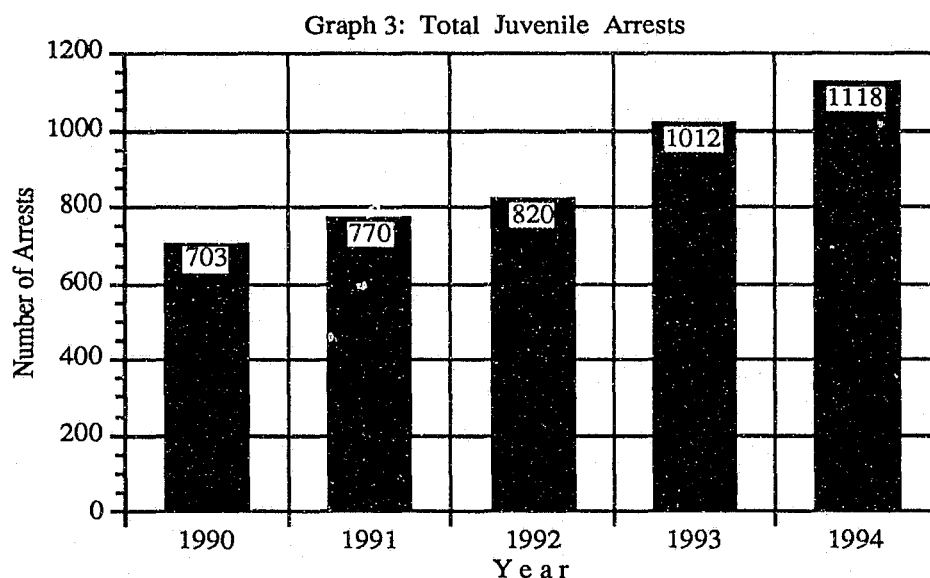
Graph 1: Adult Arrests - 1994



Total adult arrests increased by 15 percent from 306 in 1993 to 352 during 1994. Although arrests decreased for liquor law violations (60 to 41) and OMVWI (97 to 82), there were increases in arrests for simple assault (27 to 37), disorderly conduct (41 to 71), and "all other" offenses (19 to 61). The thirteen drug arrests each involved possession of marijuana.

Example 2 - Juvenile Arrests (5 years)

Graph 3 shows the total number of juvenile arrests made by the Neenah Police Department from 1990 through 1994.



The total number of juvenile arrests increased by 59 percent from 1990 to 1994. There were increases in the number of juveniles arrested for vandalism (25 to 82), theft (92 to 245), burglary (16 to 43), simple assault (19 to 111), disorderly conduct (38 to 74), and "all other" offenses (37 to 164).

G. INDIVIDUAL CRIME ANALYSIS

Law enforcement agencies occasionally request other information on specific UCR offense categories. The following table shows the number of Violent Index crimes reported to the **Madison Police Department** from 1990 to 1994. The figures have been converted into crimes per day and the likelihood of being a victim.

H. SUMMARY

These pages have presented examples of how figures from the Annual UCR Report can be used by individual agencies. Additional possibilities for analysis include more detailed breakdowns of burglary and theft targets, weapon usage in violent crime, drug arrest details (see **TABLES 7 and 8**), and law enforcement strength (see **TABLE 9** of the 1994 Annual Report). In addition, arrest rates (both adult and juvenile) can be obtained in the same way that offense rates are calculated in **TABLE 2**. Instructions for obtaining arrest and offense rates are presented in Appendix I (Glossary) of this report.

Also, the State UCR Program can provide graphical presentation of crime and arrest figures if an individual agency lacks the capability. In addition, various crime figures can be presented on either a county-wide or regional basis.

APPENDIX III: HATE CRIME

The State of Wisconsin has collected basic information on "Hate Crime" since 1991. Collection of these incidents was mandated by the U.S. Congress with implementation given to the F.B.I. and respective State UCR Programs. However, this is the first year that summary statistics on Hate Crime have been presented in Wisconsin's annual Crime and Arrest Report.

Only crimes reported to law enforcement agencies are included in these Hate Crime statistics. Also, it should be noted that about half of Wisconsin law enforcement agencies submitted Hate Crime forms during 1994.

Summary 1994 statistics on the 39 reported Hate crimes are as follows:

The 1994 figures are quite similar to those of previous years in terms of the proportions of offense type, location, and bias motivation.

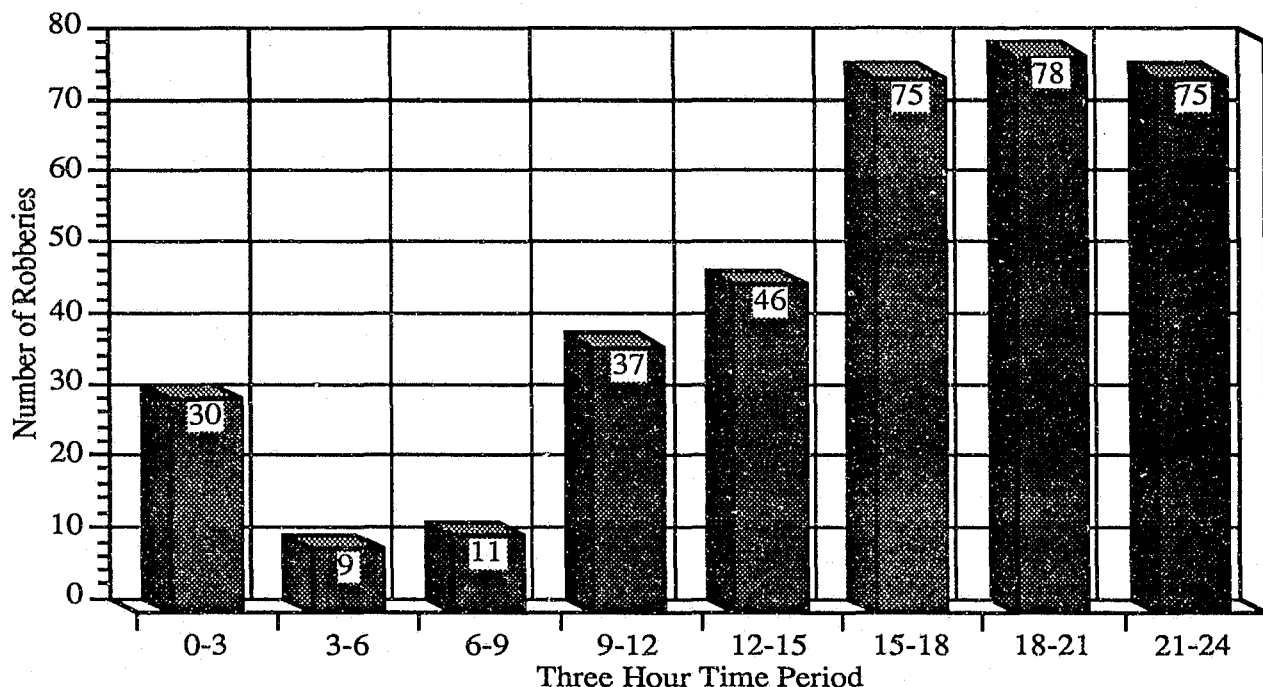
APPENDIX IV: INCIDENT - BASED DATA EXAMPLES

As noted in the introduction to this report, several Wisconsin agencies have been certified for Incident-Based Reporting (IBR). The submission of IBR data permits the analysis of a variety of data elements which cannot be studied in the older summary-based UCR Program. For example, IBR data includes information on victims, location and time of offenses, weapon use, type of injury, and more detailed data on property and illegal drugs.

The data presented in this appendix are drawn from various Wisconsin agencies which have submitted IBR data since 1989. The figures have been combined over all submitting agencies and represent crime data from 1989 through 1994.

Graph 1 shows the time of day when robberies were committed. The day is divided into consecutive three hour segments (e.g., "0 - 3" equals midnight to 2:59 a.m., "3 - 6" represents 3:00 a.m. to 5:59 am, and so on).

GRAPH 1: ROBBERY - TIME OF DAY



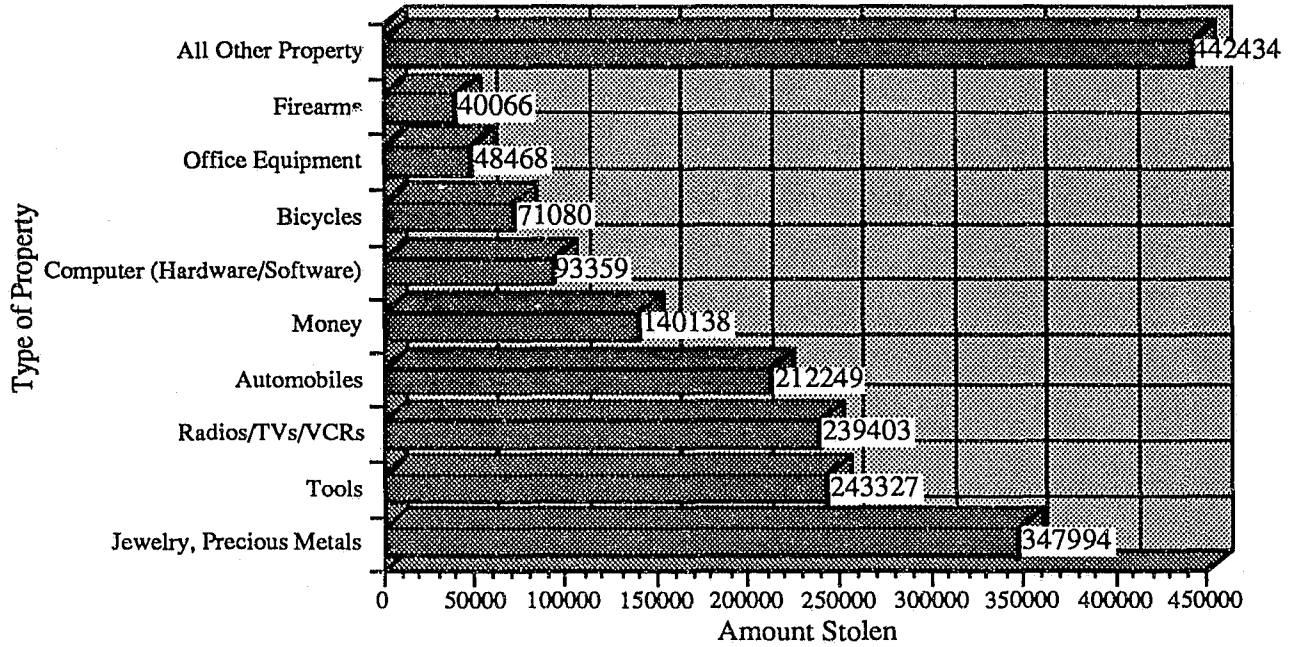
Nearly 61 percent of the 361 robberies were committed between the hours of 2 p.m. and 11 p.m.

In terms of robbery victims, there were 391 individuals, 89 businesses, and 18 financial institutions. Since a robbery may have multiple victims, the total number of victims (498) exceeds the number of robberies.

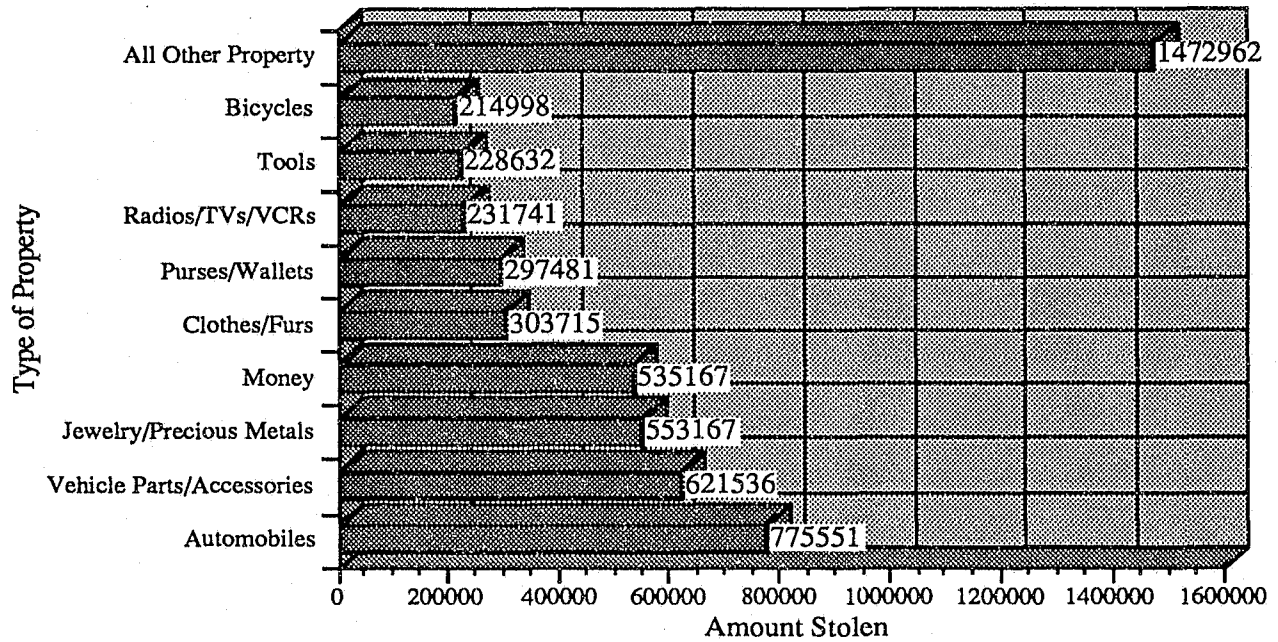
An analysis of the 391 individuals victims shows that 315 were not physically injured, 71 suffered minor injuries, and 5 had serious injuries.

Graphs 2 and 3 show the amount of property stolen in burglaries and thefts. The most common property categories are shown in each graph.

GRAPH 2: BURGLARY BY TYPE OF PROPERTY LOSS

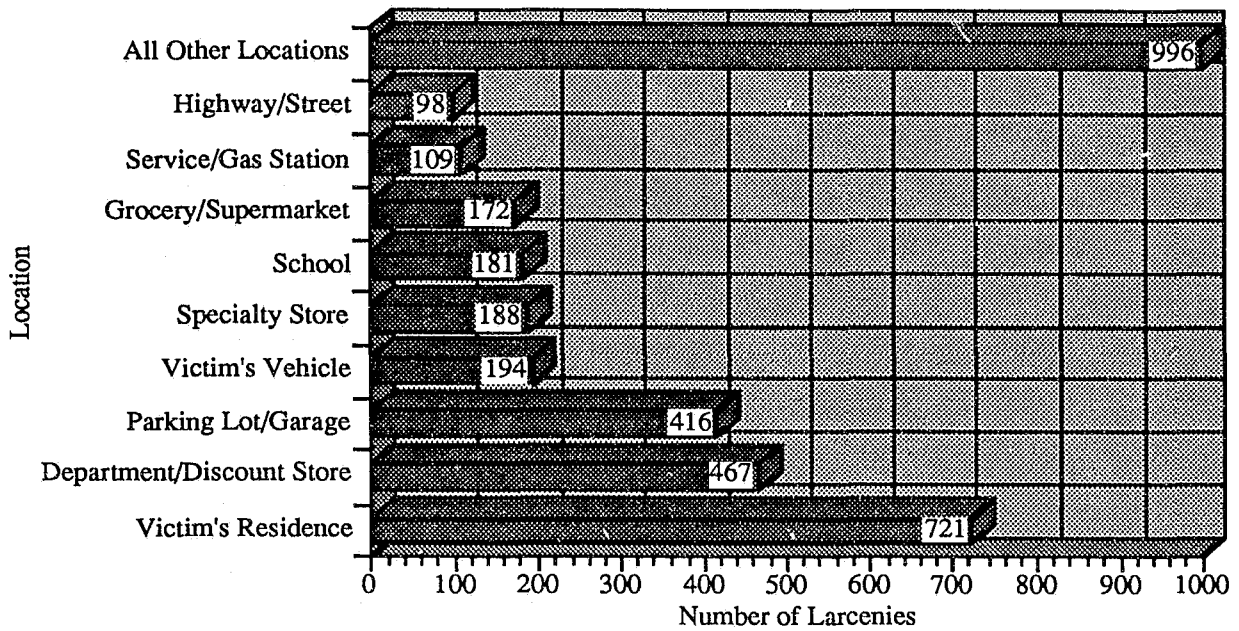


GRAPH 3: LARCENY BY TYPE OF PROPERTY



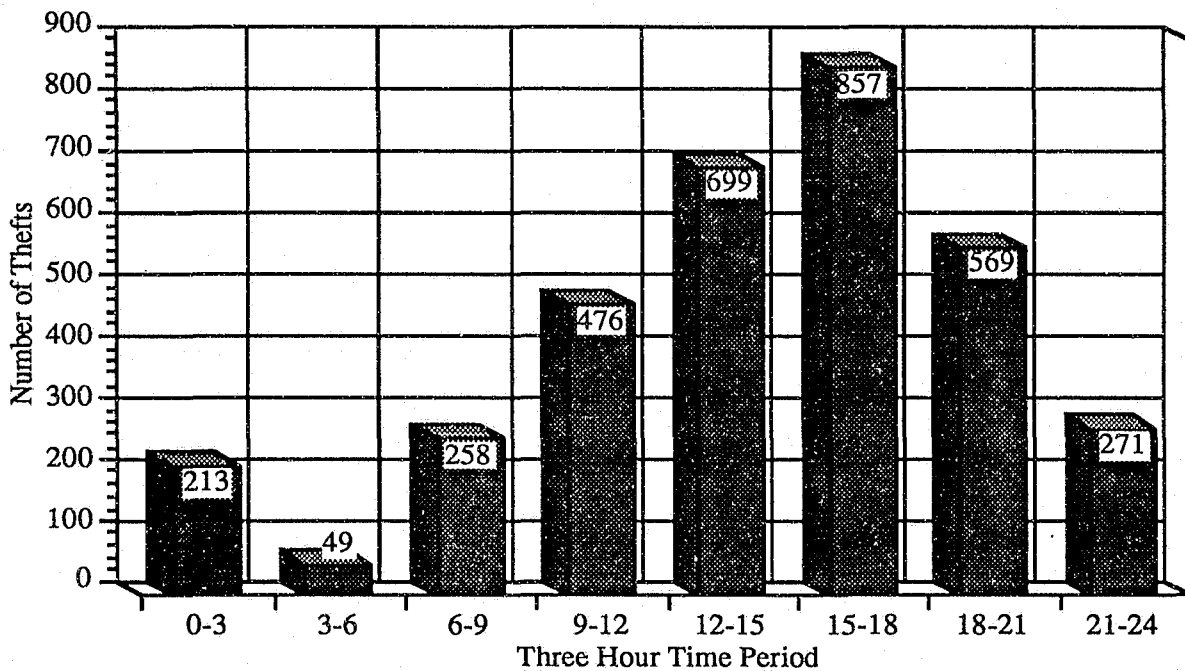
Graph 4 shows the location of reported larcenies.

GRAPH 4: LOCATION OF LARCENY



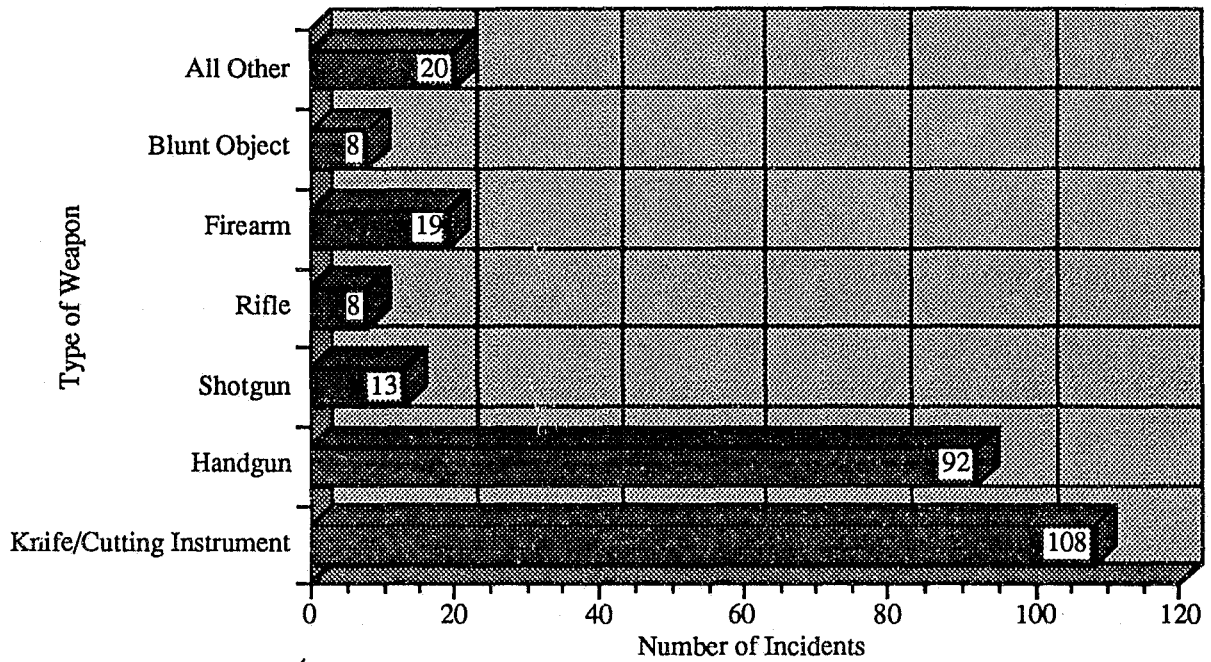
Graph 5 shows the time of day of the theft. Again, the day is divided into consecutive three hour segments.

In terms of weapon category, knives and firearms dominated, accounting for 89.5 percent of all incidents. The 268 incidents included six cases in which multiple weapons were involved - four with a firearm/knife combinations, one with two firearms, and one with a knife/personal weapon combination.

APPENDIX V: ARRESTS

The next six tables present statewide figures for various arrest categories.

The first two tables show 1994 adult and juvenile arrests. All age categories are shown, subdivided by sex and arrest category. Note that the state totals in these listings may differ from the corresponding totals shown in Tables 5 through 8. This is because data in these two tables represent reported data, not estimated figures.

The last four tables show ten year trends in arrests of adults and juveniles. Arrest figures are shown for all Part I crimes and selected Part II crimes. These tables show estimated arrests for each year.
